An evening of classics with Manna Dey

A beautiful spring evening was drastically altered by an unexpected cold shower on February 19, but inside the Bangladesh China Friendship Conference Centre, music enthusiasts had something or rather 'someone' who had the capability to take their minds off the inhospitable weather.

Eminent Indian singer Manna Dey took admirers down memory lane with his classics at the first of his two shows.

Embrasure Films, Inc and Priyanti Edit and Effects jointly organised the shows titled 'Manna Dey Night' to raise funds for Sidrvictims in the south-western region of the country. Half of the proceeds from the shows will be donated to the Chief Adviser's Relief Fund for the rehabilitation of the Sidrvictims, according to the organisers.

Noted Indian singer Arundhuti Holme-Chowdhury also performed at the show.

Arundhati started with a Tagore song Dariye achho tumi. That was followed by Ei din jeno protidin phirey phirey ashey. After four more songs and a short break came the long-awaited moment. Manna Dey took the stage and rendered Shopno jodi modhur emon and Ei kuley ami aar oi kuley tumi. Classics like Chainey banchte ami premhin hajar bochor, Ami ajibon shudhu bhool korey gechi and the heart-rending Shey amar chhoto bon received rounds of applause.

"Music is my passion and language has never been an issue," said the veteran artiste and crooned the evergreen hindi number from the film Wagt, Aye mere Zohra Jabeen. Even at the age of 89, the rendi-

tions did not seem to lack the youthful vibrancy and versatility the artiste is known for.

After another short break

Arundhati once again took the stage and rendered Emni korey jaye jodi din, Joto bhabna chilo and Sraboner dharar moto.

Decades on, the song still pulsates within the memory of countless people. As Manna Dey breathed life into the song that has single-handedly made his voice immortal to generations of Ben-

galis, Coffee House-er shei addata aaj aar nei, the crowd seemed rapt. Throughout the evening, the singer received over 160 requests.

"This is my fifth visit to Bangla-

desh and I am delighted to be here on this stage and sing to you all, said the gracious artiste. The second show was held at the

"Hridoye Mati O Manush" turns five

Call for an agricultural revolution

Hridoye Mati O Manush needs no introduction to the Bangladeshi TV audience. Hosted by media personality and agricultural activist Shykh Seraj, (Director, News, Channel i), the programme started initially on BTV as Mati O Manush in 1982, and later continued on Channel i from February 21, 2004.

The informative programme is an initiative to encourage the farmers and developments in the agricultural sector. It covers all aspects of agriculture, its problems and possibilities and ways of improving the farmers' livelihood.

According to Seraj, "My targetaudience initially consisted of farmers and I advised them on ways to improve their agricultural activities. In time the viewership has not been limited to just the farmers, now traders and investors take interest in the show as well. Which is why I have shifted my emphasis to all aspects of agriculture."

To keep the countrymen abreast of agricultural developments at an international level, Seraj has already filmed several episodes of Hridoye Mati O Manush in countries such as the Philippines, Thailand and China.

It also informed them on the simpler ways of production, transportation and marketing and how to avoid dealing with the unnecessary middlemen. Meetings were also held with the farmers before In the first three years, the the national annual budget each programme introduced farmers to year. Farmers were shown docu-

mentaries on 'handling food safely', 'fertiliser shortage', 'Asian farming methods', and 'the agricultural views of Rabindranath Tagore'.

"Some of the topics covered in the fourth year were 'potato production'; 'the past, present and future of the dairy industry'; 'the salt industry'; 'jute production and

industry'; a follow-up on 'the use of urea and other harmful chemicals in puffed rice'; 'casaba farming in the Monga-prone areas'; 'shrimp farming in Khulna'; 'unavailability of safe fertilisers'; 'the erosion of river banks and the tribulations of the affected people'; 'bird flu awareness' and special coverage of the Bengal Meat Industry of Pabna and the farmers market of Bogra, says Seraj. Seraj adds, "Some of our recent


agricultural advancements are 'the reduction in the use of urea and the introduction of gutti urea'; 'the introduction of hybrid rice'; 'the successful farming of baokul', and 'the farmers market of BDR and the local government'."

Shykh Seraj has received the Ekushey Padak along with three other National Awards -- National Youth Award, Fisheries Award and Poultry Award. He was awarded USA Ashoka Fellow in 1993. In recognition of his contribution to the agricultural sector, Young Asia Television of Sri Lanka produced a documentary on him.

A new programme, Krishi Deebanishi, also hosted by Seraj, is currently on air on Channel i, as an extension of Hridoye Mati O Manush.

ITI Theatre Festival '08 "A satisfactory arrangement"

Nasiruddin Yousuff is the Organising Secretary of Bangladesh Centre of International Theatre (BCITI). He served as the president of the Committee for Cultural Identity and Development (CIDC), a part of the ITI Worldwide Committee, three times. Currently he is the Director of CIDC. The committee focuses on promoting dramatic forms and expressions, which are essential components of cultural identity. Current CIDC projects deal with wide-ranging themes such as resolving socio-political conflicts through artistic collaboration.

The convenor of the reception committee at the ITI Theatre Festival, Yousuff said, "This year's arrangement is satisfactory. Nineteen foreign delegates have arrived in Dhaka to participate at the festival, in which leading troupes of the country will stage their popular productions. For the third time the Worldwide Executive Committee meeting is being held here."

"We are arranging workshops, however, BCITI should consider arranging other activities such as producing plays involving the leading artistes of the country. The foreign experts can also contribute to this type of theatre," You suffadded.

Nasiruddin Yousuff believes that with the help of UNESCO, ITI should introduce scholarships in theatre at the universities in the west for students from the developing countries. This can develop the technical standard of world theatre, which is currently in turmoil.

"Urubhangam": A play with an anti-war message

As part of the ITI theatre festival, Department of Theatre and Music, University of Dhaka (DU) staged an adaptation of Bhasa's Urubhangam, based on the epic Mahabharata, on February 19, at Natmandol, DU campus.

As done in the traditional Sanskrit theatre style, accompanied by acoustics, seven actors enter the stage and subsequently pay homage to the gods Brahma, Vishnu and Shiva. Displaying different spectacular stances the actors continue this performance until a narrator takes the audience to the concluding part of the Kurukshetra (the battleground where Pandavs

and Kauravs are fighting) mentioned in the Mahabharata. In this part, the Kaurav hero Duryodhana starts a club (gada) fight with his rival, the Pandavhero Bhima. The energetic young actors, with

appropriate body movements and voice modulation, successfully created the brutality of war and deceit -- suggested by Lord Krishna, the leading light of the Pandavs, Bhima strikes Duryodhana on his thigh with the gada, which is considered 'dishonest' according to the laws of club fight. This act of violating the rules of war

makes Balarama (played by Noor-us-Saiyem Khan) agitated. Even the leg-

endarywarrior Ashwathama (played by H.M. Shahjalal) announces that he would have his revenge over the Pandavs. But Duryodhana (played by Syed Marnun Reza) does not allow the Kauravs to take revenge on Bhima for his immoral act, rather he regrets his previous actions and finds peace in heroic death. The epilogue urges for peace.

The essence of Sanskrit theatre has been aptly presented in the directorial compositions of Wahida Mallik. Her sense of proportion in art is noteworthy. The director's ability to create a climax in the sequence where the protagonist of the play, Duryodhana, in his last moments, meets his family members is laudable. In this scene, Ashiqur Rahman Leeon's performance as the aged and blind Dhritarashtra, father of Duryodhana, was remarkable. Syed Mamun Reza as the dying hero Duryodhana performed well.

Another important aspect of the play is the simple yet effective set and light designs by Syed Jamil Ahmed. Baby Rozario's dance composition and Aklima Islam Kuheli and Tapan Kumar Sarkar'smusic composition have enriched the aesthetics of the play. The performance by the Depart-

ment of Theatre and Music on February 19 was a relief to the audience in the midst of several average theatre productions.
