

The central bank yesterday asked all commercial banks to reduce lending rates from March to cut export and import costs and curb the soaring prices of essentials.

Bangladesh Bank (BB) Governor Salehuddin Ahmed warned the bank does not want to step in, but if the banks fail, the BB might have to take steps to reduce the spread between deposit and lending rates themselves, sources said.

### Khaleda denied bail

A Dhaka court yesterday summarily rejected the bail petition of detained former premier Khaleda Zia in connection with the Niko graft case, as the case was filed under the Emergency Power Rules (EPR).

Judge Mohammad Azizul Haque of Metropolitan Sessions Judge's Court passed the order after defence lawyers submitted a petition seeking bail for Khaleda

On February 17, the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) obtained permission to interrogate Khaleda at the sub-jail gate in connection with the case, but is yet to interrogate her.

Khaleda was shown arrested in the case following a petition submitted by the IO of the case on December 30 last year.






