

Advocating transparency and comparability of financial reporting

CARE-Bangladesh and Responsible Business Initiative (RBI) are organizing an intensive 2-day workshop specifically designed for professionals from *Business, NGOs, Academia and Media*, who seek the necessary knowledge, skills and tools to produce globally comparable reports on their organization's social, environmental and financial performance in a transparent manner. The workshop aims to familiarize participants with the current context and trends in Corporate Social Responsibility, Triple Bottom-line Reporting (TBL) and guide them through the stakeholder process required for TBL documentation using the Global Reporting Initiative's G-3 guidelines.

About the Training

The Training is designed in response to the increasing demand among suppliers in developing countries to measure up to the expectations of buyers from consumer societies with regard to social and environmental integrity of supply chains in developing countries. It includes discussions, practical exercises, mini-case studies, and presentations, visiting experts and practice tasks on the themes listed below:

Day 1: Appreciating The Challenge

Understanding CSR – A Driver of Competitiveness

What is CSR? Does CSR work? What are the difference between CSR and TBL? What are the dilemmas and risks to competitiveness for companies, now and over the horizon? How does consumer acceptance fit into a company's risk management strategy? What are the opportunities in globalizing markets? Can social investments; environmental stewardship and responsible profits create market advantage?

Expectations - The Responsible Business Framework

What is expected from leaders in business and society? What is the Responsible Business Framework? Integrating & implementing CSR through *Responsible Business Framework*.

Day 2: Marshalling A Response

Public Disclosure - As a Competitive Strategy

How can supply chains show product responsibility? In an information age, what is the benefit of public disclosure? How can companies engage their stakeholders and manage stakeholder feedback for transparent disclosure of their Triple Bottom-line? What are some practical ways to implement public disclosure programs or desired benefit?

The How-To - Action Tools for Process-led Documentation

What are the key skill-sets and tools that decision-makers or documentation professionals need to effectively document and report on their TBL? How can these skills be developed within the traditional company environment? How does the GRI-G3 aid in building capacity, moderating the stakeholder process, collating data, and producing a meaningful TBL report? How it all adds up to building reputation and image?
