"The national coal policy will be formulated very soon but not within one month. We are scrutinising the proposals submitted by the previous review committee. A final committee will be formed very soon to set out rules and regu-

lations of the policy," he said. Prof Tamim was speaking as the chief guest at a roundtable on 'Development of Bangladesh's Coal: Strategy & Method' at Cirdap auditorium in the city.

He also said that time has come to take a decision on coal extraction because the gas reserve is declining day by day.






