Poultry industry incurs loss of Tk 4100cr

Speakers at a meet the press yesterday urged the government to prepare a strategic plan categorising the poultry farms through a technical committee to strengthen their biosecurity management and save the country's overall poultry indus- try.

The press meet was organised jointly by Watchdog Bangladesh and Bangladesh branch of World's Poultry Science Association (WAPSA) at the National Press Club in the city with a view to removing bird flu panic from the mind of the consumers by sensitising the media.

Applauding the government for taking all cautionary measures to contain the spread of bird flu, the speakers said all the poultry farms should be registered.

They said as of February 27 last, some 191 poultry farms were affected with Avian Influenza (AI) and 50 percent of the country's total farms were closed down due to bird flu panic and other reasons causing a loss of more than Tk 4100

Storm disrupts power supply

A major part of the Dhaka city,

including the southeastern area, plunged into darkness as the season's first storm swept through the city early hours of yesterday.

Official sources said three grid sub-stations at Maniknagar, Narinda and Bangabhaban have tripped as soon as the storm started at about 3:00am.

It took several hours to restore power supply to the areas. The consumers in Motijheel, Wari, Tikatoli, Narinda and Lalbagh suffered the worst where electricity was restored after 12 hours at about 3:00 pm.

Some areas under Desco also faced the similar sufferings. A top Desco official told UNB that their 19 distribution feeders out of 40, which cover the eastern and northern parts of the city -Mirpur and Gulshan were tripped by the storm.

"But, within minutes to few hours we have been able to restore

the power supply", he said. A DESA official claimed power supply to the Bangabhaban, the president's house, was restored immediately through alternative arrangement.

GRAFT CASE AGAINST IQBAL

Judgment deferred to March 11

The judgment in a graft case against former Awami League lawmaker HBM Iqbal, which was scheduled to be delivered yesterday, has been deferred to March 11 as the judge of the Special Court-1, Firoz Alam, has been on leave.

The case was filed against Iqbal on charges of amassing huge wealth through illegal means and concealing information in the wealth statement submitted to the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC).

ACC Assistant Director Mohammad Ibrahim filed the case against Iqbal, his wife Dr Momtaj Begum Dolly and other family members with Gulshan police on June 25.

The other accused are their sons Moinuddin Iqbal and Imran Iqbal and daughter Nawrin Iqbal.

According to the case statement, Iqbal concealed information about an illegally acquired Tk 5.3 crore house at Gulshan Avenue, which he registered in his wife's name, and a Tk5 crorefixed deposit.

OC Rafique's name dropped from charge sheet

Dropping the name of prime accused suspended officer-incharge (OC) AKM Rafiqul Islam from the charge sheet, detective branch (DB) of police yesterday pressed charges against eight people for killing college student Kamrul Islam Momin in September

DB Inspector Forman Ali, who is also the investigation officer (IO) of the case, submitted the charge sheet against the accused to the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's (CMM) Court, Dhaka showing 24 people as prosecution

The chargesheeted accused are Hasibul Haq Jony, Tareq alias Zia, Babu alias 'Thotkata' Babu, Shakhawat Hossain alias Jewel, Mohammad Jafar, Habibur Rahman Taj, Sharif Uddin and Monir Hawlader. Of them, Monir is on the run while the rest are now in jail custody.

The IO dropped names of 20 others as their involvement with the murder was not proved.

The charge sheet will be placed before the court on March 23 for its acceptance.

The CMM's Court on July 22 last year ordered reinvestigation into the matter after Momin's father filed a naraji (noconfidence) petition against the charge sheet submitted by the Criminal Investigation Department (CID). On May 13 last year, CID sub-

mitted the probe report dropping OC Rafique's name from the charge sheet, as his involvement with killing was not proved. Momin, 18, a Commerce

College student, was killed by a gang of criminals in front of his house at Kafrul when he was going to college on September 13, 2005.

Following the incident, Momin's father Abdur Razzak had filed a murder case with Kafrul Police Station against OC Rafiq and 25 others.


On October 16, 2005, prime accused Rafiq was sent to jail after he surrendered to a Dhaka court seeking ad interim bail in connection with the killing. He has been in jail custody since then.

Garment workers protest layoffs in city

Around 3,000 workers of a unit of Padma Garment staged a demonstration in front of the factory at Tejgaon Industrial Area yesterday in protest of layoffs.

The police said the management of Padma Poly Cotton Knit Fabrics Ltd. posted a notice on the factory gate yesterday morning announcing its closure.

Enraged by the notice, the workers who came to their workplace in the morning gathered together to stage a demonstration, but a large contingent of police, deployed

there since early morning, dispersed them.

Shafiqul Islam, officer-incharge of Tejgaon Industrial Police Station, said the factory owner announced layoffs as the workers had remained absent for the last three days following a clash between the garment workers and other staffs of the factory.

He also said the garments workers also beat the factory staffers, prompting them to lodge a case with the police

Abdul Kader, a worker, said the situation has been tense since Thursday when a workers' leader Azad, who is close to the management, had scuffled with the workers over tiffin.

The scuffle erupted as Azad and his associates were trying to force the workers to have 'low quality' tiffin being served by the management, he added.

Since then, the workers were demanding removal of Azad from the factory, Kader said.

As the workers remained absent from their work on some floors on Monday to press their demand, officials and staffers close to the management beat up at least three workers, Liton, Saiful and Shahinoor, prompting the workers on all floors to join the agitation programme.
