The two parties also called for holding a free and fair election as per the roadmap.



"The government should sit with the political parties immediately to find out ways to mitigate the suffering of the poor people and labourers, caused by the price hike of essen-

tials," Badruddoza told reporters. Both the party chiefs called on the government to intensify the anticorruption drive and to take steps to prevent corrupt people and black money holders from standing in the election.

'Tarique held on political motives'

Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) yesterday alleged that the government arrested and kept detained its Senior Joint Secretary General Tarique Rahman "purely with political motives" as no allegation against him was proved.

A statement issued by BNP Office Secretary Rizvi Ahmed in the name of Khaleda-appointed Secretary General Khandaker Delwar Hossain said Tarique has been detained in prison for the last one year. "He was arrested on false and fabricated charges as the government has not yet been able to prove any single allegation

against him."

The statement says Tarique is now seriously ill following "physical and mental torture" and seclusion in the prison for last one year.

"The torture was meted out to him is not only inhuman but also against all principles and justice," it said, adding that keeping him detained without trial is tantamount to a "flagrant violation of human rights".


