The Awami League (AL) and Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB) yesterday jointly demanded announcement of parliamentary election schedule and asked for roadmap.

Tofail said the government should not do anything that may delay the electoral process.

\$85,204 Japanese aid for persons with disabilities

Japan will donate \$85,204 to Centre for Disabilities in Development (CDD) for its 'Construction of Training Complex for Craftsman of Artificial Limbs for Disability' project, says a press release.

To this end, Japanese Ambassador to Bangladesh Masayuki Inoue and Executive Director of CDD AHM Noman Khan signed an agreement yester-

Using the grant, CDD, which has been actively working to improve social and economic status of the handicapped, will build a training complex for the craftsmen of artificial limbs for disability in Savar.

Currently there is no training centre for such craftsmen, while 5,000 to 7,000 craftsmen are needed against 7.8 million persons with disabilities.

Through this project, the Japanese government hopes that artificial limbs will be more available in Bangladesh and that the handicapped will have more opportunities to participate in social and economic activities.

The Government of Japan has been extending Grant Assistance for Grass-roots Human Security Projects through NGOs since 1989 in Bangladesh. A total of 137 projects have already received grants worth \$9.7 million.

British Muslim media guide launched

People to decide on state of emergency

Says Australian envoy

Australian High Commissioner Douglas Foskett yesterday observed that the people of Bangladesh are to determine whether the next elections would be held under state of emergency.

"It's possible to do anything in Bangladesh if people want," he told journalists when asked if he thinks elections could be held under the current state of emergency

Foskett was speaking to journalists after a meeting with the Election Commission in the morning. Chief Election Commissioner Dr ATM Shamsul Huda and Election Commissioners M Sohul Hussain and Brig Gen (retd) M Sakhawat Hussain were present at the meeting.

"You cant' have elections until the registration (voter listing) and other processes are done," the Australian envoy said about the political parties demand for early polls.

Asked if a free and fair election is possible within the year, Foskett said he does not see any reason why there should not be free, fair and transparent elections by this yearend since the election process is going very well and the EC is very competent.

He hoped that the elections would be held this year and they are looking forward to a successful process towards the polls.
