## NU degree exams begin on Mar 31

Degree pass and subsidiary examinations of 2007 under the National University (NU) will begin across the country on March 31, says a

press release. A total of 223844 students from 1403 colleges will sit for the exami-

nations in 490 centres. Of the pass students, 123986 are male while 97543 are female.

A total of 30126 students are taking part in BA first year, 26977 students in second year, and 43345 students are taking part in third year exams.

In BSS first year exam, 32409 students are appearing while 4437 and 5801 students are taking part in BSS second and third year exams.

In BSc first year exam, 4125 students are appearing while 4427 and 3238 students are taking part in second and third year exams. In BCom first year exam, 16673

students are taking part while 15426 and 14545 students are taking part in second and third year exams. Besides, 82 students are appear-

ing in B Music, 50 in B Sports, 577 in certificate courses and 1606 students are participating in subsidiary examination.

The NU authorities have already completed all preparations to conduct the exams smoothly with the cooperation of colleges concerned and local administration.






