Draw looms large MSC-Biman crucial tie

A spirited fightback by South Africa after Virender Sehwag's brutal assault the previous day left the first cricket Test against India headed for a draw on Saturday.

India, resuming at the overnight 468-1 in reply to South Africa's first innings total of 540, failed to maintain the momentum and were all out for 627 by tea on the fourth day.

The tourists easily wiped out the 87-run deficit and closed the day at 131-1 in their second knock with opener Neil McKenzie following his 94 in the first innings with an unbeaten 59.

Hashim Amla, the first innings hero with 159, was the other batsman at the crease on a fluent 35.

Sehwag, who resumed at his overnight score of 309, was dismissed for 319 within the first 30 minutes of play and only Rahul Dravid's 111 ensured India a first innings lead.

Dravid reached the 10,000-run mark on way to his 25th Test century, but the only other notable contribution for the Indians was Venkatsai Laxman's 39.

South African fast bowler Dale Steyn claimed four of the last five wickets to finish with 4-103. Leftarm spinner Paul Harris was the most expensive with 3-203, while Makhaya Ntini ended with 3-128.

Some 35,000 home fans, who were hoping Sehwag would surpassWest Indian Brian Lara's world record score of 400 not out, were silenced soon after the start of the day's play.

Sehwag added 10 runs to his overnight score when he edged a drive off Ntini into the safe hands of McKenzie at first slip.

Sehwag received a thunderous applause from the crowd and teammates as he returned after an epic nine-hour effort that contained 43 boundaries and five sixes in the fastest recorded triple century in history.

Dravid put on 45 for the fourth wicket with Sourav Ganguly and 47 for the fifth with Venkatsai Laxman before being caught in the slips off Ntini after lunch.

Ntini struck again in his next over, this time forcing star batsman Sachin Tendulkar to edge a catch to Jacques Kallis at first slip before he had scored.

Dravid joins 5-digit club

Rahul Dravid of India on Saturday became the sixth batsman in history to score 10,000 Test runs when he reached 80 with a single to midwicket off Morne Morkel in the first Test against South Africa here.

The 35-year-old former captain chalked up an innings of 111, his 25th Test century, before he was caught in the slips by Jacques Kallis off Makhaya Ntini after lunch on the fourth day.

Dravid, playing his 120th Test, averages 55.41 with a personal best of 270 against Pakistan in Rawalpindi in 2004.

Of the six batsmen in the exclusive club, only Dravid, Brian Lara and Sachin Tendulkar have scored more than 10,000 runs in both Test and one-day cricket.

The elite 10,000-run club, led by Lara, includes three Indians, Tendulkar, Sunil Gavaskar and Dravid, and two Australians, Allan Border and Steve Waugh.

Hammam calls for strong club base

Asian Football Confederation (AFC) president Mohammad bin Hammam stressed the need for a strong club structure as he inaugurated the foundation stone of the country's first artificial turf at an elaborate ceremony at the BFF Bhaban yesterday.

Hammam also left behind a message ensuring continued support by AFC and FIFA and urged the country's football association to repair the rifts which might hinder the development of the game in the long run.

As part of the second Goal project, Bangladesh was due to receive an artificial all-weather turf and with the unveiling of the foundation stone, the dream looks that bit closer to reality, with Hammam assuring completion of the work by 'the end of this year.'

The artificial turf which is to be located on the 'Balur Math' next to the BFF Bhaban will, according to BFF President SA Sultan, support "football all year round during both day and night." Hammam's fourth visit in as

many years has coincided with a

ground-breaking meeting that has

seen an amendment in the BFF

constitution to endorse the forma-

tion of Football Associations (FAs)

all of which Hammam considers to be a good sign. "The formation of the FAs and this amendment in line with the Vision Asia project will bring some much needed discipline and stabil-

ity in football of this country. "Bangladesh lacks sorely behind the advanced continents of Europe and even many countries in Asia. This is a step in the right direction," said Hammam.

He conceded however that in order to be really successful in the long run, Bangladesh would need the stringent efforts of both human and financial resources to the FA
