Bangladesh Railway (BR) will suspend its train services for nearly two hours during the morning and evening rush hours every day in the capital from April 14 to help ease traffic congestion.

All train services, except for a few commuter rains, will remain suspended from 8:00am to 9:00am and 4:50pm to 6:00pm once the new scheme is implemented.

The BR authorities will have to reschedule the timing of around 14 trains in the eastern zone as per the proposed schedule, railway officials said.

The step comes from the railway following repeated requests from police at a time when traffic congestion in the city has turned into a complete mess.

GRAFT CASE HC rejects SQ Chy's petition

The High Court (HC) yesterday dropped the writ petition filed by detained former BNP lawmaker Salahuddin Quader Chowdhury challenging the authority of the Anti-Corruption Commission to sue him on corruption charges as his lawyer balked at hearing.

As the petition came up for admissibility hearing, the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) attorney produced relevant government gazette notifications as to the reconstitution of the watchdog. Barrister Rafique-ul Huq, counsel

for Salahuddun, prayed for withdrawing the petition, following which the HC division bench of Justice M Imman Ali and Justice AFM Abdur Rahman passed an order rejecting the petition as "not pressed".

On April 6, Salahuddin filed the writ petition challenging the locus standi of the ACC in suing him for corruption as he alleged that the body was reconstituted without following the prescribed rules.

The ACC filed a case against him on June 13 last year for amassing wealth illegally and concealing information about his wealth in his February 25 statement to the antigraft watchdog.
