

CDA raises citizens' hopes for plots

Fast development of residential areas and fair allocation of plots by Chittagong Development Authority (CDA) have raised hopes among the common people for a piece of land in the port city.

Success in three projects encourages it to plan for more such residential projects with relaxed conditions for plots, sources said.

With the latest allotment of 1521 plots in Ananya Residential Area on April 21 the CDA has allocated 2351 residential plots under three projects since March 22, 2006.

On the other hand, the authorities could allocate 3526 plots in eight other housing projects developed since 1961.

These eight residential areas include Agrabad CDA Residential Area (R/A) with 774 plots, Silimpur R/A with 1029 plots, Karnaphuli Bamir R/A with 516 plots, Chandaon R/A phase I and II with 689 plots, Chandrima R/A 183 plots, Faujderhat R/A with 164 plots, Halishahar R/A with 22 plots, Katalganj R/A with 51 plots, Sholoshahar R/A with 98 plots and Karnaphuli R/A with 516 plots.

Of them, the projects in Silimpur and Karnaphuli scheduled to be implemented by 1983 and 1993 are yet to prove success as the authorities concerned could not provide utility services till date.

Delay in implementing the projects and reported nepotism and irregularities in allotment

process earned a bad name for CDA when common people hardly thought of applying for plots, sources said.

Situation, however, started improving after a new allotment policy was introduced in 2005 with honest and professional officials.

The CDA, under the new policy, introduced open lottery system for allotments of plots among 400 applicants, out of 1047, in Kalpaloke first phase on March 22, 2006.

The lottery was held nine

years after the project was initiated in June 1997 and over three years the application forms were submitted with an average deposition of Tk 1.5 lakh by November 17, 2002.

The CDA holds lottery for plots in Kalpaloke second phase only after five months (on August 29) the same year in participation of almost double number of applicants. A total of 1924 applications were submitted with deposit money of Tk 5 lakh each by October 2, 2007.

The lottery scheduled for November was delayed due to complexities in land acquired for the project before it could be held on April 21.

To cater the increasing need for housing, CDA now plans to develop two more projects over

500 acres of land in Bakalia and Quish areas in the city within a short time, said the sources.

The expatriates will have priority for the plots in these residential areas. The project at Bakalia will be developed in the shape of China town where apartment buildings will house commercial establishments in the lower floors and residential apartments on the upper floors, sources said.

"CDA has already submitted a proposal for developing the Fateyabad New Township on 5000 acres of land at Fateyabad involving around Tk 6000 crore, said CDA Chairman Shah Muhammad Akhter Uddin while talking to this correspondent at his office on April 21.


He said they are proceeding for the projects for which 2.5 hectares (over 100 acres) of land are needed for 400 plots on each hectare," he said.

He said the CDA will involve developers for construction of buildings with a provision of 20 per cent apartments for the low-income group.

Akhter said they are thinking of relaxing the conditions for owning the developed plots, extending time for making payment in several installments and reducing the rate of interest to a tolerable limit.

Besides, CDA has taken initiative to revive Salimpur residential and Karnaphuli residential projects, he said.

He said the CDA will serve notice to the owners of 100 plots under alternative use or lying vacant at Salimpur R/A to ensure their proper use within a month.

Pirated books flood city markets

Students face problems, traders count loss and government deprives of revenue

Pirated copies of books of higher education are flooding the bookshops in the port city, causing loss to the importers and distributors alongside depriving the government of revenue.

The students are also facing problems due to supply of such pirated books by a section of unscrupulous traders.

The books, reprinted and marketed in violation of copyright act, are now available at different bookshops in the city.

Police unearthed an illegal printing press and godown, seized huge quantity of such pirated books and arrested two people in this connection on April 16. A case has also been filed with Kotwali Police Station in this connection the same day.

Detective Branch (DB) of Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP) led by Assistant

Commissioner (AC) Ashiqul Hoque Bhuiyan unearthed the press and four-room godown (storehouse) during its drive at a market near Boro Masjid on Sirajdulah Road at Chandanpura in the port city.

Some 20,000 pirated books of different courses of higher education like MBBS, MBA, engineering and basic sciences worth over Tk 1 crore were seized from the godown.

Two people identified as Tofajal Hossain Sajib, 27, an MBA student of Chittagong University and Shamsuddin, 35, were arrested in this connection.

The books of MBBS courses include Human Anatomy by BD Chaurasia, Human Anatomy by AK Datta, Atlas of Human Anatomy by Frank H Netter, Taber's Cyclopedic Medical Dictionary, Langman's Medical Embryology, Test Book of Medical Physiology, Essentials

of Human Anatomy by AK Datta and others.

Huge copies of books used in MBA course like Principles of Marketing by Philip Kotler and Gery Armstrong, Accounting Principles by Weygandt, Kieso and Kimmel, Marketing Management by Philip Kotler and Kevin Lane Keller, Essentials of Managerial Finance by Scott Besley and Eugene F Bridgman, Business Mathematics by DC Sancheti and VK Kapoor and Organization Behaviour were found stockpiled at the godown.

The recovered cache also included pirated books of basic sciences like Advanced Organic Chemistry (for BSC and MSC student) by Arun Baht and BS Baht, Modern Inorganic Chemistry by RD Madan, Theory and Problem's of Vector Analysis by Murray R Spiegel, Advanced Engineering Mathematics by HK Dass, Modern Microeconomics (The-

ory and Applications) by HL Ahuja and many other books.

Detectives also launched such a sudden drive and seized 108 copies of pirated academic books of MBBS courses from five bookstalls at Shahi Jame Mosque Shopping Complex at Anderkilla on January 22.

The bookstores were Panguine Library, Book Eden, Orient Book, Book Garden and Hossainia Library.

A case was filed under Section 82 of the Copyright Act with Kotwali Police Station in this connection. But, the bookshop owners were on the run until obtaining bails from the High Court in the capital to avoid the arrest.

"Since then we were in search of the press and the persons involved in publishing and marketing such books and at last we succeeded," said Ashikul while talking to The Daily Star on Saturday.

DB Inspector Mezba Uddin Ahmad, investigation officer (IO) of both the cases, will submit charge sheet in the first case soon.

Meanwhile students, teachers and traders demanded exemplary punishment to those involved in such illegal business.

Chittagong Medical College (CMC) Principal Prof Dr MA Wahab said students will face problems if they use pirated books with illegible prints and poor quality pictures of different human organs and diagrams.

He said in medical study picture is very important and unclear picture might give a

wrong message to the students. Limon, a CMC student, said they prefer to buy the pirated copies of books due to their cheaper rates. He said sometime they get those at half the price or one third of reduced rates.

Gulam Mostafa, Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Parama Publisher and Distributor, said they have been incurring a huge loss every year.

He said the pirated copies are small in size compared to the original ones and are published in one colour with bellow quality pictures while the original copies are four coloured.

Moreover, below quality papers are used in publishing the pirated copies to keep the price cheaper, he added.

Parama Publisher and Distributor is reportedly the lone importer and distributor of foreign academic books of different higher courses.
