Hasanat began his entrepreneurial journey in 1996 when he joined Youngones Fashions Ltd, a small garment factory, as the chief executive officer. The company offered him 10 percent stake as a working partner.

At one stage, other partners of fiscal year. the company decided to quit the business. But Hasanat's business instincts inspired him to take a risk. He approached banks and bought the rest 90 percent stakes.

He shifted the factory to Tongi from Tejgaon to start production.

Ikebana has grown further. It has moved to a 3,000-sq-feet office at Banani, which offers floral deco-

The turnover of Ikebana, which has a workforce of 60 people, reached Tk 87 lakh in 2006-07. Enterprise of the Year

Bengal Plastic Industries Ltd, one of the country's biggest and oldest plastic goods manufacturing factories, was awarded 'Enterprise of the Year 2007'.

The company began its journey in 1969 in old Dhaka when the company started manufacturing plastic spare parts for jute

Inspired with the initial success, the company installed automatic machines in 1978 and expanded production base, manufacturing household utensils such as plastic

In 1991, Bengal Plastic Industries started to manufacture accessories especially plastic hangers for exportable garment industry. It got a boost in business after winning contracts to supply crates to Coca Cola and Pepsi in

The company's turnover hit \$35 million (Tk 245 crore approximately) in 2007. It has a manpower base of around 2,000 people.

The company won the national export trophy twice in 1997-'98 and 2000-'01.

The open market sale (OMS) programme of food directorate will be ended on April 30 across the country while rice sale at the OMS outlets reduces today.

An OMS dealer is going to sell rice 1020 kilograms instead of 1500 kg from today in the city.

Director General of Food Directorate Pias Costa told The Daily Star yesterday that, "The OMS programme across the country will be ended on April 30 as per previously scheduled decision of the government."

When asked about extension of the programme, he said no decision is yet to make regarding the time extension.

The time of OMS programme may be extended for 15 days, said other sources.

Currently, a total of 6,800 OMS dealers across the country are selling rice three days a week. Of them, 687 OMS dealers sell rice in Dhaka City Corporation area.

The government launched its countrywide OMS programme on January 9 at the rate of Tk 25 per kg in the wake of unprecedented hike ofrice prices.

In addition, the direct sale of food directorate in the city and elsewhere in the country will also be ended on April 30. The directorate reduces the numbers of trucks to 40 from 60 in the city.

Meantime, Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) will continue its fair price markets in the city and elsewhere in the country.

Concern Worldwide, an international humanitarian organisation, organised the competition to encourage the children of pavement dwellers.


