

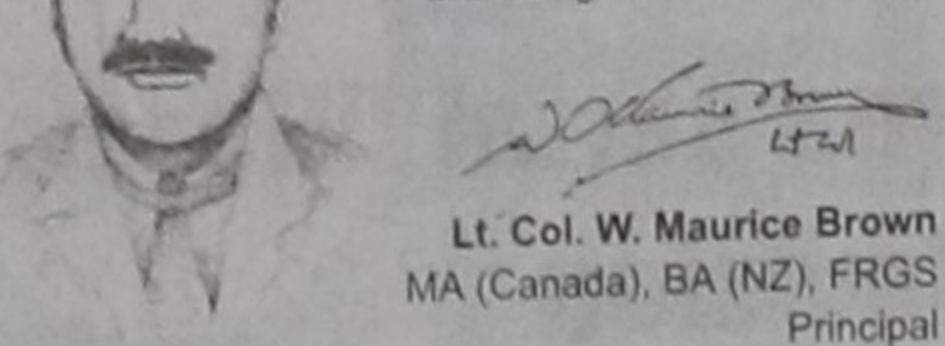

HISTORY: The system of Cadet College was first introduced in Germany in the era of Bismark. Then Napoleon Bonaparte introduced this in France. Military and Royal aristocrats would send their children or wards to those cadet colleges for education and a career in the Royal Army. Here the system was introduced by the then president of Pakistan Field Marshall Ayub Khan. The initial four cadet colleges were Hasanabdal, Kohat, Faujdarhat and Petaro.

The government of the then Pakistan established the first cadet college on the model of English public schools. The college was directly under management and supervision of the armed forces and military education was made compulsory in it. After successful establishment of FCC, three other Cadet Colleges were established as JCC, MCC & RCC. Meanwhile, the government created a residential model school in Dhaka in 1960. Following its success as an educational establishment, six more residential model schools. After independence in 1971, the government of Bangladesh did not establish any new cadet college but converted the six residential model schools (outside Dhaka) into cadet colleges in the 1980s. And with recent inclusion of 2 more for girls', at present, there are 12 Cadet Colleges in Bangladesh.
