Plan to build 67 more cyclone shelters in coastal areas

To withstand natural calamities like cyclone and tidal upsurge, government will build 67 more cyclone shelter-cum schools in the seven coastal upazilas of jointly by ministry of education Chittagong district.

Sources said the district administration recently sent a list with a proposal for constructing new multipurpose shelters to the ministries concerned.

When constructed, the number of cyclone shelters in the entire district will rise to 470 in 14 upazilas.

They said the cyclone Sidr in mid-November last year had ripped through the southern belt and wrought devastating havoc along the coasts of Barisal, Patuakhali, Bagerhat, Khulna, Barguna and other coastal districts taking away scores of lives of both human and livestock.

At that time, Chittagong was also under great threat of Sidr, albeit escaped the wrath of nature. The administration had toiled hard during its pre-cyclone preparations to evacuate coastal people to safer places because of the inadequate number of shelters and out of 90, in the offshore upazila of miserable condition of the existing shelters. As emergency measures, the district administration then opened up different schools to of this highly disaster-prone area, provide shelter to the coastal people and that reality prompted them in 1991. to realise the necessity of many more cyclone shelters in those vulnerable areas.

The upazilas where the proposed shelters will be built are: Anwara, Banshkhali, Sitakunda, Mirersarai, Chandanaish, Satkania construction of new shelters they and Sandwip.

Sources said the shelters would be used for multi-purpose, both as cyclone shelter and school.

"Of the 67 shelters, 34 will be multipurpose one.

used as secondary school and 33 as primary school purposes before or after any natural disaster," said

They said around 64 shelters, Sandwip are in a vulnerable condition and requiring urgent repair for keeping them usable for the people which was devastated completely

Anwara is another vulnerable upazila where 40, out of 60 shelters, are in very bad shape now, they said.


