Sylhet secure regional title

Sylhet banked on Rumman's halfcentury to become regional champions after they defeated Moulavibazar by 34 runs in the 28th National Cricket Championship at the Sylhet Stadium yesterday.

The right-handed batsman smashed two sixes and three boundaries in his 68 made from 105 balls as Sylhet posted a competitive total of 218 in 49.3 overs. The visitors replied in earnest but fell short as they were bowled out for 183 in 47 overs. Saiful topscored with 61 while for Sylhet, Tanhar took three for 33.

But it was not all plain-sailing for the hosts in another part of the country as Jessore succumbed to a four-wicket loss at the hands of Thenidah.
