BCB sets Tigers plan

Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) is considering a national camp at the Shaheed Chandu Stadium in Bogra to train the Tigers under floodlights ahead of next month's tri-series.

The triangular tournament that involves India and Pakistan will be played under lights at the Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium in Mirpur and so the cricket operations committee felt the necessity of the camp in Bogra.

"We will finalise after talking with our coach (Jamie Siddons). We felt that the players should train under floodlights because all the matches would be day-night (in the tri-series). And in our consideration, Bogra is the best place for the training," informed Gazi Ashraf

"But before taking the final decision we must also talk with local power development officials lights during practice," he added.

Rajasthan Royals strolled to the top of the table of Indian Premier League with an eight-wicket win over Deccan Chargers, who offered little resistance in a match that was effectively decided in the first innings. Deccan posted a belowpar 140 and looked listless as academy under the auspices of Rajasthan's efficient batting chased the target with four overs to spare at the Sawai Man Singh Stadium on Friday.
