Cabinet okays Ordinance

UNB, Dhaka

The Council of Advisers yesterday approved in principle the Upazila Parishad Ordinance 2008, creating two posts of vice-chairman in the local government body, one reserved for women.

The ordinance provides that the chairman and two vice chairmen of the upazila parishad will be directly elected by voters. Union parishad chairmen, municipal chairmen and elected women members to the reserved seats of wards under the upazila concerned will be members of the upazila parishad.

Chaired by Chief Adviser Fakhruddin Ahmed, the meeting of the Council of Advisers sent the draft of the ordinance in the light of some suggestions for vetting by the law ministry and asked for placing it again before the council "as soon as possible".

Under the new ordinance, dispute regarding election cannot be filed with any other court except for election tribunal. The election tribunal and election appellate SEE PAGE 15 COL 8

Envoy to UAE sued for misuse of power

ACC Deputy Director Abdullah Al Zahid filed the case with Shahbagh Police Station under sections 409 of the Penal Code and 5 (2) of the Corruption Prevention Act, 1947.

The complainant in the first information report (FIR) brought three allegations against the ambassador.

He accused Nazimullah of irregularities in renting the ambassador's house, corruption in purchasing furniture for the abode and appointing gardeners at his resi-

Another cyclone heads toward Myanmar

Another powerful storm headed toward Myanmar's cyclonedevastated delta, where so little aid has reached that the UN warned yesterday of a "second wave of deaths" among an estimated 2 million survivors.

The US military's Joint Typhoon Warning Center said there is a good chance that "a significant tropical cyclone" will form within the next 24 hours and head across the Irrawaddy delta area.

The area was pulverised by Cyclone Nargis on May 3, leaving at least 34,273 dead and 27,838 missing, according to the government.

The news of a second cyclone was not broadcast by Myanmar's state-controlled media. But Yangon residents picked up the the Internet.

Move on against people out to hoard rice

Food ministry will send a letter to the Bangladesh Bank (BB) today urging it to ask private commercial banks not to provide loan facilities to individuals who might use it for stockpiling rice.

The initiative is aimed at mak-

ing the current boro procurement drive of the government successful and stabilising the price of rice, said food ministry sources adding that the BB earlier instructed all commercial banks to ensure that their rice miller clients repay loans within three months of disbursement of the loans. Meanwhile, the boro procure-

ment drive that was launched on April 17 has yet to gain momentum.

As per the data provided by sources at the food ministry, the govern ment, till May 11, procured only 17,584 tonnes of boro -- paddy 3,609 tonnes and rice 13,949

The government set the boro procurement target at 15 lakh tonnes by August this year. Out of the procurement, 12 lakh tonnes would be rice and 3 lakh tonnes paddy, said the ministry sources. The food ministry officials are

hopeful that the government will be successful in reaching the target hoping to procure the major portion of the target in June and July. The government during the last

boro season procured 7.06 lakh tonnes of rice.
