Trouble thy name is Shoaib

Kolkata Knight Riders on Saturday threatened to take "all actions including legal" against Pakistan's daily Nation for its report that fast bowler Shoaib Akhtar was questioned at the Karachi airport for allegedly carrying a large number

"We are contemplating all action including legal against the paper," Knight Riders manager Jay Bhattacharjee told newspersons

Other reports add, contrary to Akhtar's reported claim that the syringes recovered from his luggage by customs officials were meant to inject himself with insulin, Pakistan Cricket Board (PCB) officials in Lahore say the fast bowler, rather than being diabetic, is infamous for being a druggie who had been using cocaine and performance-enhancing drugs to

boost his bowling speed. Shafqat Naghmi, chief operating officer of the PCB, expressed ignorance over the medical history of the Rawalpindi Express, saying as far as he knows, former skipper Wasim Akram was the only Pakistani fast bowler known to be an insulin-dependent diabetic. "It is for the first time that I have heard of the fast bowler suffering from diabetes and will have to recheck with his personal physician to find

out if he was actually a diabetic." However, another senior PCB official, who requested not to be named, said Shoaib had been using performance-enhancing Kings were on the right end of the drugs, cocaine, and cannabis for almost four years now and was banned on the same charges in November 2006 from playing international and domestic cricket after failing a drugs test. He pointed out that Shoaib never took this plea during the hearing of the doping charges against him by a three-member tribunal. Mohammedan Sporting Club dropped six players including captain Mohammad Ashraful, Aftab Ahmed and Zunaed Siddiqui but went on to beat City Club by seven wickets at the BKSP in Savar yesterday.

After their humiliating ninewicket defeat to archrivals to Abahani last Thursday, the Mohammedan management decided to axe the Tigers trio along with Anwar Hossain, foreign recruit Ageel Arshad and seamer Tapash Baisya.

Suharwardi Shuvo was handed the captaincy and Imtiaz Ahmed, Imrul Kayes, wicketkeeper replaced the fallen six.

Motijheel giants as right-arm spinner Arafat took away the manof-the-match award with a splendid three-wicket haul that destroyed City Club who were bowled out for only 136 runs in 28.2 overs. Later, another replacement Rashedul smashed five sixes and only two fours in his 90-ball 60 to power Mohammedan to an easy victory in 30.2 overs.

City were never in with a chance when they lost their top-order for just 65 runs in the 17th over when their last recognised batsman Abul Bashar (12) fell to Yasin. Later, Shafaq Al Zabir struck 47 off 34 balls with the help of five sixes and three boundaries.

Mohammedan's new look batting order began in the wrong foot but Rashedul restored parity Nadimuddin, Rashedul Haq, and along with Nadimuddin (37) Sabbir Ahmed and Yasin Arafat and Rokibul Hasan (9*), one of three national colours who sur-

vived the chop.

Meanwhile, BKSP posted a fivewicket victory over Surjo Torun at the Fatullah Cricket Stadium. Batting first, Surjo Torun rode on Shamsur Rahman's 72 to score 206 in 49 overs. The right-handed opener struck as many as 13 boundaries but the rest of the innings stalled after his dismissal. Later, it was Shamsur's Academy teammate Nasir Hossain who took BKSP to the victory. Nasir slammed 65 off 86 balls including four boundaries and a six.

For Surjo Torun, Mohammad Younis took the wickets of Mohammad Mithun (40), Ashraful Aziz (11), Simon Ahmed (1) and Mushfigur Rahim (5) but his performance was marred by an under-par effort from the rest of the bowlers.

Mario Almada struck a golden goal as a spirited India suffered a narrow 1-2 defeat to Argentina in the final of the Azlan Shah hockey tournament on Sunday.

Sandeep Singh's 10th minute penalty corner conversion put India ahead in the title clash, but veteran Almada led Argentina's fightback and scored a brace (14th, 73rd) to help his side clinch the championship.

India will take the silver medal with pride as they showcased a brilliant turnaround in the tournament and won four matches in a row after two defeats to book a berth in the final after a huge gap of 12 years.

The title clash had all the components of a final match as the keenly contested and ill-tempered encounter went down to the wire before being decided through Almada's golden goal in the extra-time.

From the beginning, both the wingers of Argentina worked overtime to give some jittery moments to the Indian defenders. But SEE PAGE 18 COL 1


