IPL chairman and commissioner Lalit Modi announced that the organisers would issue an all-area accreditation badge to one member of each of the eight team franchisees, following the ejection of Shah Rukh from the dug-out by the Anti Corruption and Security Unit (ASCU) officials of the International Cricket Council (ICC).

Shane Warne has not ruled out a dramatic return to international cricket for the next Ashes series if Australia's problems with trying to fill his spin position continue. Warne retired from internation-

als following the final Test against England in Sydney last January, and earlier this year ended his firstclass career by withdrawing from his Hampshire deal.

However, he has been one of the outstanding performers in the Indian Premier League with the Rajasthan Royals, who currently top the league table, taking 14 wickets at 18.78. At the same time Australia are struggling to find a consistent, frontline Test spinner, although Stuart MacGill's recovery from wrist surgery has been a promising sign.

It was thought that MacGill would slot straight back into the team last season, but after two poor Tests against Sri Lanka when he was afflicted by injuries he opted for an operation which kept him out for the majority of 2007-08. 
