The Ukrainians mounted little in the way of a challenge and the Dutch were deservedly in front after 24 minutes when Kuyt headed in a cross from Giovanni van Bronckhorst.

In the 37th minute, Klas-Jan Huntelaar was set-up by Rafael Van der Vaart to score his seventh goal in 12 internationals to make it 2-0.

Van der Vart was also influential in the creation of the third goal, supplying the crucial pass for Babel to score in the 64th minute.

Goals from French centre-back Philippe Mexes and Italy midfielder Simone Perrotta sealed a ninth cup success, making them the most successful team in Italian cup history, alongside Juventus.

Inter substitute Vitor Pele scored a goal that even his more illustrious namesake -- the Brazilian legend who won three World Cups -- would have been proud of with a stunning 30-yard volley into the top corner that left Roma's Brazilian goalkeeper Doni rooted to the spot.

The two sides have contested the last four cup finals and Roma squared the recent mini-series following Inter's victories in 2005 and 2006.

Despite missing the game injured, Roma club captain Francesco Totti went up to receive the silverware from Italy president Giorgio Napolitano.

Roma coach Luciano Spalletti said he was happy to win but that the result of one match shouldn't change the way people view a season as a whole.

"Lifting the cup is of little importance in the grander scheme of things, we need to give more merit to the way of working over the whole season," he said.

Terry said in an open letter to 'the fans published on the club's website he had been sleeping very badly and, at some level, was hoping it was all just a bad dream.

He slipped as he was about to take the spot kick, bringing out United's 6-5 penalty shoot-out victory in Moscow after the match had finished at 1-1 following extra time.

Had Terry converted, it would have been the winning penalty but then Manchester United keeper Edwin Van der Sar saved from Nicolas Anelka to end Chelsea's dreams.

Addressing the club's fans, players and employees, Terry wrote: "I am so sorry for missing the penalty and denying you the fans, my teammates, family and friends the chance to become European champions.

"Many people have told me I don't need to say that but I feel I need to, that's just me. I have relived that moment every minute since it happened. I have only slept a few hours and wake up every time hoping it's all been a bad dream.

"I have had some amazing support from fans, current and explayers, family and friends and I need to thank everyone for that. But I am a big man and I take responsibility for us not winning.

"I am and always will be Chelsea through and through. I will give my all on and off the pitch to win this trophy as a player and one day as a manager. And I am sure we will win it. And if it comes to yet another

"That night in Moscow will haunt me forever and I feel I have let everybody down and this hurts me more than anything. I am not ashamed about crying. "This is a trophy I have tried so

hard year after year to win and it was just an uncontrollable reaction, I wear my heart on my sleeve, everybody knows that.

"The road to Rome (where the 2009 final takes place) starts here, we have to try and turn this experience to our advantage. I am very proud of how far we have come this season with everything that has gone on. Thank you for all your support for the season."
