

A businessman and convenor of Mirpur zone Progressive Democratic Party (PDP) led by Ferdous Ahmed Quarishi was gunned down last night at Pallabi in the capital.

The victim is identified as Nazrul Islam Chowdhury alias Montu, 48, a trader of jhut (fabric clippings from garment factories).

Police with the help of locals captured two of the fleeing assailants after a gunfight.

One of the captured criminals, Javed, suffered serious injuries in mob beating while the other, yet to be identified, suffered bullet wounds to his leg, said police.

The World Bank is going to consider two proposals for \$320 million loan to Bangladesh in its next board meeting on June 17 as the government has fulfilled a number of conditions set by it.

A loan of \$200 million is likely to be provided under the transitional power sector development, sources in the Economic Relations Division (ERD) said. These loans will be given as budgetary supports.

Govt officials oppose EC plan to hold JS, UZ polls simultaneously

The divisional commissioners yesterday opposed the Election Commission's (EC) plans for holding upazila parishad polls together with the ninth parliamentary election.

They aired their views at a meeting with Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) ATM Shamsul Huda at the EC Secretariat.

Coming out of the meeting, attended also by divisional deputy election commissioners, Huda said if not held together upazila election would precede the parliamentary

Heads of the divisional adminis tration cited a number of difficulties in holding the national and local government elections simultaneously. They said it will require a huge number of polling officials, ballot boxes and other logistic supports.

Besides, they added, the voting process and counting will be slow and it all might lead to untoward

situation. The CEC said they would soon seek opinions of the deputy commissioners and superintendents of the police on the issue as they will be the ones playing a crucial role in SEE PAGE 15 COL 6

HC VERDICT ON URDU-SPEAKING PEOPLE

Many still consider Pakistan homeland

The High Court (HC) verdict of awarding Bangladeshi citizenship to stranded Urdu-speaking people could not settle the long-standing debate as many of them still want to return to Pakistan.

These people, totalling around three lakh, living in different designated housing camps across the country, are now divided into two groups -- one group wants to be rehabilitated in Bangladesh while the other still wants to go back to Pakistan after being deprived of

their rights in the last 37 years. A number of camp residents interviewed by this correspondent appealed to the government to

make arrangements for repatriating the willing stranded Pakistanis to their homeland in Pakistan.

They argued that the Urdu speakers would never be able to live in this country with honour as there is no assurance that the ongoing humiliation and discrimination against them would cease to exist in future.

Opponents of this view, on the other hand, say the stranded Urdu speakers, who were born and raised in Bangladesh, have every right to enjoy their birthrights to live like a regular citizen of this country where they would not be forced to live in housing camps.




