Agyan Party men rob 3 of Tk 3.5 lakh

Members of 'Agyan Party', a gang of criminals, took away Tk 3.5 lakh from them in two separate incidents in the city yesterday.

Sources said at least five people were admitted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) after being victimised by the criminals.

One of the victims, Mohammad Badal, 35, of Bhanga upazila in Faridpur, was found in an unconscious state at Fakirapul at around 4:00pm.

Police rushed Badal to the DMCH and after he regained consciousness, he said he started for Dhaka with Tk 2.0 lakh with an intention to go to Malaysia. He was on board a bus. But he could not recall anything what happened

In another incident, Abdul Jalil, 30, and his cousin Maksud, 28, of Narsingdi were victimised while they were on way to Banani from Sayedabad Bus Terminal. They were rescued in unconscious condition from Banani area.

After they got back to their senses, the victims said a gang of criminals took away Tk 1.5 lakh

Besides, police rescued one Alauddin, 35, from Sayedabad in the morning and an unidentified 60-year-old man from old Dhaka.

20m infected with Hepatitis B virus a year Says WHO study

At least 20 million Hepatitis B Virus (HBV), 2.0 million Hepatitis CVirus (HCV) and 0.26 million HIV new infections are associated with unsafe use of injections every year across the world, experts quoting a WHO report said yesterday.

seminar on 'Injection use and risk of HBV, HCV and HIV infection: Intervention for risk reduction' at the British Council auditorium in the city. The seminar was jointly organ-

ised by Department of Clinical Pharmacy and Pharmacology of Dhaka University, Centre for Social Science Research in Health and Medicine, School of Pharmacy, University of Nottingham, UK and British Council.

After conducting a WHO-funded pilot project on 'Intervention can reduce the unsafe use', Prof AK Azad Chowdhury in a paper said, "The outcome of the pilot project is good. Unsafe use of injections can be reduced by intervention."

He said by monitoring, training and proper planning, the use of injection can be reduced.

Under the project, the teams will monitor the use of injections in upazila health complexes and train the staffs for not using injections and then plan accordingly to work for
