

Call to ensure fair price of rice, paddy for farmers

Bangladesh Krishak Samity (BKS), a platform of farmers, yesterday demanded setting up government purchasing centres at every weekly market in rural areas to ensure fair price of rice and paddy for farmers.

'Change in men's mindset a must for women's dev'

Speakers at a workshop yesterday called for changing the mindset of men for the development of women and children.

The workshop was held under a project titled 'Communication for the development of women and children' at the seminar room of the Press Institute of Bangladesh (PIB) in the city.

In the last financial year, 22 percent of the development budget was allocated for women, said Additional Secretary to Information Ministry Md Mamunur Rashid Chowdhury while speaking as chief guest at the programme.

He suggested 24 percent allocation for women in the upcoming national

budget.

Thirty-three percent of women head their families in the country.

Additional Secretary (Development) and National Project Director Kamal Uddin Ahmed said a change in social attitudes towards women is a must for the development of women.

For this, a social movement is inevitable, he added.

Chief of Communication and Information Section of Unicef in Dhaka Christine Jaulmes stressed the need for making the project effective and dynamic. Unicef will welcome any new project for the development of women and children, she added.

PIB Director General Mohammad Nazrul Islam presided over the inaugural session.

Relief team leaves for China

A 24-member team of the Armed Forces left Dhaka yesterday to provide necessary relief and medical support to the earthquake-affected people of China.

On behalf of the government, the army team led by Brig Gen Muhammad Mujibur Rahman flew to China by a BAF C-130 aircraft with the relief materials, said an ISPR press release.

Lt Gen Masud Uddin Chowdhury, principal staff officer of the Armed Forces Division, saw the team off at Kurmitola Air base.

Assistant Chief of Air Staff (operation and training) Air Vice Marshal Muhammad Enamul Bar, Chinese Ambassador to Bangladesh Zheng Qingdian and senior military officers were present on the occasion.

The team will hand over the relief goods to the Chinese authorities. The relief materials include medicine and tents weighing approximately 9.5 tons.

A devastating earthquake hit Sichuan province of China recently leaving over 80,000 people dead and 300,000 others injured.

To overcome the worst effect of the disaster, Bangladesh government took a decision to send the relief goods to China as a token of brotherly gesture.

300 awarded Chevron scholarships
