


On behalf of the Government and the people of Bangladesh, I pledge our continued support to the United Nations for promotion and protection of world peace.

UN peacekeeping operations span the globe. As of May 2008, the Department of Peacekeeping Operations manages 20 peace operations, composed of nearly 130,000 authorized military, police and civilian personnel. The demand for peacekeeping has increased rapidly since the end of the Cold War. Over the past four years we have deployed or expanded 11 missions, and in the last year alone we have fielded peace missions in the Darfur region of Sudan and its neighboring Chad/CAR. The 2007-2008 UN budget for operations stands at \$6.65 billion. UN peacekeeping has never been as large, complex or demanding as it is today.

Peacekeeping is not only expanding, it is also changing. For UN peacekeeping to succeed in the future, we need to sharpen our tools and adapt to the demands of wider mandates and difficult tasks. The Department of Peacekeeping Operations is currently implementing a strategy, "Peace Operations 2010," which is a package of reforms in five prioritized areas: personnel, doctrine, partnerships, resources, and organization. Moving forward in these areas will strengthen the ability of our blue helmets to tackle inter- and intrastate conflict, while also performing tasks in support of the wider humanitarian and development agenda.

As Under-Secretary-General for UN Peacekeeping, I am deeply aware that expanding our operations in this way would not have been possible without the assistance of our member states. I would like to extend my fullest gratitude to the country of Bangladesh, which has consistently been one of the most generous troop and police contributing countries. The uniformed services of Bangladesh will be a critical partner in taking on the peacekeeping challenges of tomorrow. I am certain that the successful cooperation between the UN and Bangladesh will live on and I look forward to working together with you on the road ahead.

The United Nations was conceived by a generation that carried, fresh in its memory, the horrendous destruction of World War II. The aims of the organization reflect their experience and their wisdom: that an

institution, based on principles of international law, cooperation and progress, that gives a voice to each group within the human community, is the surest way toward peaceful relations among peoples and between nations.

While peacekeeping was not envisioned in the UN Charter, it has grown to become the flagship enterprise of the United Nations, its most visible and iconic part: the blue helmets, a multinational force in the service of peace.

This year's commemorative ceremonies come at a time when the services of UN peacekeepers are in greater demand than ever before. Thousands of men and women are taking part in UN peace endeavors around the world. Today, we pay tribute to them. Their dedication, professionalism, and courage are the UN's most important resource and our greatest pride.

As a representative of the UN in Bangladesh, I would particularly like to underscore the value of the great and generous contribution that Bangladesh has made towards UN peacekeeping. It is a source of great pride to us all that this country ranks as a top troop contributor, currently fielding more than 9,000 troops across 15 missions, from places as far afield as Sudan, Georgia and East Timor. Around the globe, Bangladeshi peacekeepers are involved in a multitude of tasks. They patrol amic peace lines, disarm warring factions, and monitor peace agreements. They do policing and assist in the restoration of the rule of law in post-conflict societies. They help build roads and public buildings. And they provide health services and train farmers. In performing these tasks, the competence and valor displayed by Bangladesh's blue helmets have earned them a special reputation among the best peacekeepers in the world.

Bangladesh's participation in peacekeeping is a sign of this nation's commitment to peace and to the goals of the UN charter. The founders of the UN would have been deeply impressed by Bangladesh's repeated and unflagging willingness to shoulder so much of the global responsibility for international peace.
