8 lakh suffer from blindness Experts tell conference

Experts at a conference yesterday said around eight lakh people are suffering from blindness in the country, and 80 percent of them are blind due to cataract which is a preventable form of blindness.

Besides, another 1.20 lakh to 1.40 lakh people are affected every year by cataract-related blindness which could be removed through surgery, theyadded.

But the total number of cataract surgery in both public and private medical colleges every year is 1.40 lakh which is only 45 percent of the requirement.


