Upbeat CIA assessment on al-Qaeda challenged

CIA director Michael Hayden came under stiff challenge Friday for portraying al-Qaeda as on the defensive after global setbacks, even in its safe havens along the Afghan-Pakistani border. Senate Intelligence Committee chairman, Jay Rockefeller, said Hayden's upbeat appraisal was not consistent with intelligence assessments provided his committee over the past year.

Gujjar agitation: Rajasthan govt replaces top cop

The Rajasthan Government has removed Director General of Police (DGP) AS Gill, apparently unhappy over his handling of the ongoing Gujjar clashes in which at least 42 people have been killed. K S Bains, Special Director General (anti-corruption bureau), has taken over the charge. Home Department sources said the administration was upset over Gill's handling of the Gujjars' who have been agitating for the past nine days demanding Scheduled Tribes status.

Myanmar warned against premature resettlement

A UN official yesterday warned against prematurely resettling parts of Myanmar destroyed by a cyclone and human rights groups lashed out at the country's military leaders for evicting storm refugees from relief camps. Hundreds, if not thousands, of displaced people also have been expelled from schools, monasteries and public buildings, Human Rights Watch said in a release Saturday. In the nation's biggest city, Yangon, there were eyewitness reports of one such eviction from a Christian church.

Anupama Rao Singh, regional director of the United Nations Children's Fund who visited the affected area recently warned Saturday against premature resettlement, even if it's voluntary. She did not confirm that evictions had taken place. "Premature resettlements to the villages, even if it's voluntary, will cause serious risks to the refugees," she said. "Many of the villages remain inundated with water, making it difficult to rebuild. There is also a real risk that once they are resettled, they will be invisible to aid workers. Without support and continued service to those affected, there is a risk of a second wave of disease and devastation," she added.

of the junta's handling of the humanitarian crisis, saying obstruction of international efforts to help cyclone victims cost "tens of thousands of lives." Gates, speaking in Singapore, said the US has not had problems helping other countries in natural disasters while still respecting their sovereignty. With Myanmar, he said, "the situation has been very different at a cost of tens of thousands of lives. Many other countries besides the United States also have felt hindered in their efforts." He said that the US will continue to try to get aid in. US ships off the coast of Myanmar are poised to leave because they have been blocked from delivering assistance to the ravaged country. Shortly after the cyclone struck, the US, France and Britain sent warships loaded with relief supplies, but the Myanmar regime has refused to let them land, apparently fearing a foreign invasion.

Ex-Pak minister denied entry to India

Indian immigration authorities refused entry to a former Pakistan human rights minister who helped Indians imprisoned in Pakistani jails, including a convicted spy who spent 18 years on death row, officials said yesterday. Anwar Burney, who served as human rights minister in Pakistan's caretaker government earlier this year, had planned to attend a terrorism conference in New Delhi organized by local rights group. "This is the most heartbreaking moment in my life... I can't understand how the Indian government could deport a person who is relentlessly working for the good of Indians lodged in Pakistani jails," The Times of India newspaper quoted Burney as saying before being deported Friday at New Delhi's airport. Indian media and Burney's local hosts expressed outrage at the authorities' decision. The Home Ministry ordered an investigation into why he had been sent back to Dubai in the United Arab Emirates, from where he had flown to New Delhi, ministry spokesman Onkar Kediasaid.

Lanka rebels show no signs of peace: Official

The Tamil Tigers have shown no sign they are genuine about wanting peace even though the door remains open for a return to negotiations, a senior Sri Lankan official said yesterday. "We are looking for a negotiated end to this conflict... so far they have shown no inclination to enter into any constructive dialogue with a

view to ending this conflict," Palitha Kohona, a secretary with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, told reporters on the sidelines of a regional security summit. He said the LTTE (Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam) is free to come back to the negotiating table but... must do so genuinely with a commitment to negotiating a sustainable peace and for that it must also leave aside its weaponry.

Kohona's comments at the Shangri-La Dialogue -- or Asia Security Summit -- came as the separatist Tamil Tigers rejected government plans to devolve more power to the island's north and east, while a pro-rebel website said they had killed 31 troops in the latest fighting. There was no immediate comment from Sri Lanka's defence ministry.

Myanmar cyclone aid delay costs 'tens of thousands of lives': Gates

The Myanmar military junta's delay in allowing international aid into the cyclone-hit country cost "tens of thousands of lives," US Defence Secretary Robert Gates said yesterday. Speaking at a top-level security conference here, Gates said US ships could have quickly delivered much needed aid to Myanmar in the aftermath of the May 2-3 storm that left 133,000 people dead or missing. "Our ships and aircraft awaited country approval so they could act promptly to save thousands of lives -- approval of the kind granted by Indonesia immediately after the 2004 tsunami and by Bangladesh after a fierce cyclone just last November," Gates told the regional

forum. "With Burma, the situation has been very different -- at a cost of tens of thousands of lives." Gates added that many other countries besides the United States have also felt hindered in their efforts to help Myanmar recover from Cyclone Nargis. "Despite these obstructions, we continue to get help into Burma and remain poised to provide more," he said, reiterating that the US does not support the use of force to deliver assistance. "My own view is that (force) will be a serious mistake and it clearly has been a policy of our government and we don't expect it to change." He said many governments including the US have tried to reach out to the leadership of Myanmar after the cyclone.

Thai PM orders crackdown on anti-govt protest

About 1,200 riot police assembled on Saturday in central Bangkok, waiting for an order from the Thai prime minister who has threatened to forcibly break up an extended anti-government protest. At least 2,000 protesters defied the threat and continued to block a major avenue in the city's historic district, with some activists fashioning improvised shields and batons out of plywood boards and wooden rods. The protest by the People's Alliance for Democracy (PAD) began last Sunday and has at times drawn up to 10,000 people, according to police. Two years ago PAD protests against former prime minister Thaksin Shinawatra led to a coup that ousted him from power. Now the alliance says it wants the newly elected Prime Minister Samak Sundaravej to step down, accusing him of acting as Thaksin's puppet.

Obama, McCain in fierce new duel over Iraq

Democrat Barack Obama and Republican John McCain fought a fierce political duel over Iraq Friday, in the latest testy escalation of their fast-evolving White House race. As Obama edged closer to the Democratic nomination, each man questioned the other's qualifications to serve as commander in chief, sparring over the US troop surge escalation strategy, and future of the war. The Obama camp pounced on a comment by McCain that the US troop garrison had already been pulled down to pre-surge levels, and complained the Republican used a picture of war commander General David Petraeus on a fundraising email. McCain said in a Wisconsin town-hall meeting on Thursday that "we have drawn down to pre-surge levels," then denied on Friday he had misspoken.
