3,000 appeals filed with

Near about 3,000 appeals have been filed with the Election Commission (EC) till yesterday -the last day for the filing of appeals against re-demarcation of 51 parliamentary constituencies.

This is by far the largest number of such appeals filed by leaders of various political parties following the EC's move to re-demarcate 133 constituencies before the next
