#### CPB RALLY BLAST 2 Huji cadres

## remanded

A Dhaka court yesterday placed two cadres of the outlawed Harkatul Jihad (HuJi) outfit on a two-day fresh remand in connection with a case filed for bomb attacks on a CPB rally in 2001.

Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Ehsanul Haque passed the order after the Criminal Investigation Department (CID) produced Maulana Idris Ali and Maulana Monir Hossain to the court after the completion of a three-day remand.

The bomb attacks on the Communist Party's rally at Paltan Maidan killed five people and injured dozens on January 20 in 2001.

Making out the case for fresh remand, the investigation officer of the case told the court that the two were involved in the bomb attacks and divulged important information during the previous two-day remand.

He said the law enforcers would be able to make a significant breakthrough leading to the arrests of others involved in the attack if the two accused were interrogated further in remand.

Several other HuJi leaders and cadres, including the outfit's detained top leader Mufti Hannan, have so far been shown arrested in the case.

Idris and Monir, who are relations, are also accused in a number of cases filed for terrorist acts, including the grisly grenade attacks on an Awami League rally on August 21, 2004 and bombing of Pahela Baishakh celebrations at Ramna Batamul on April 14 in
