



The result means Australia

retain their hold on the Frank Worrell Trophy -- symbol of Test supremacy against West Indies -and have not lost a Test series in the Caribbean since 1991.

The screens display pictures about 33 per cent lighter than ordinary LED screens making them clear to view during the daytime, even under direct sunshine.

mance and background use. At present, most illumination equipment in the stadium is undergoing sustained testing, day and night, while a slew of solarpowered lamps have already been installed along the walkways outside the stadium.
