

A five-day attachment programme on rural development and poverty reduction ended at Bangladesh Academy for Rural Development (BARD) on Thursday.


Some 100 participants of 41st Foundation Training Course of Bangladesh Public Administration Training Centre (BPATC) from different cadres of BCS took part in the programme.
