In his other recommendations, Dr Atiur proposed to form registration and monitoring cell to monitor the mobility of the migrating children, psycho-social care centre for the victim of violence and also funds to rescue and reintegrate trafficked children.

RLY SCRAP METAL THEFT Seven arrested in Ctg

Railway security force caught redhanded seven people, including four railway staffs, for stealing scrap metal from its bridge factory at Kadamtali area in Chittagong vesterday.

The force also seized one-and half tonnes of scrap metal and a pick up van from the spot, sources said.

The arrestees were identified as mechanic of Bangladesh Railway's bridge factory Mohammad Shamim, staffs Jainal Abedin and Mohammad Rahmat Ullah, guard Shariat Ullah, pick up driver Badshah Mia, helper Mohammad Emran and a burglar Bashir Ullah.

However, the arrested railway staffs were released later for departmental action and others were handed over to police.

Acting on a tip-off, a team of the railway security force raided the bridge factory at around 5.00am and caught them. Three other railway staffs of the gang -- Abdul Jalil, Shah Alam and Abul Khair -managed to flee the spot.

Senior army officers were present on the occasion. Later he offered munajat along with other officers seeking success of the




