Talking to The Daily Star yesterday, some leaders from divisional units of BNP and AL said that the central committees should step in to quell the rising discontent within the parties.

Though policymakers have yet to make up their mind about the elections, the grassroots leaders in both the parties are in favour of contesting the polls. Some of them are even ready to run for the polls as independent candidates in case their organisations opt not to take part in the race.

However, sources said the parties might finally decide to join the race on strategic consideration that they might fall behind if the rivals go to polls and they do not.

Voter lists of 200

Poll schedule to be announced soon

Voter lists in around 200 upazilas will be ready in July third week, facilitating the Election Commission (EC) plan to announce poll schedule for upazila parishads in the first phase.

The EC plans to hold the long overdue polls to upazila parishads in phases before the parliamentary elections. Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) ATM Shamsul Huda on Sunday also said the commission would announce the schedule in a month.

The commission will take a decision on appropriate time to announce the schedule, Election Commissioner Muhammed Sohul Hussain told The Daily Star over telephone yesterday.

"It's been decided that we'll hold upazila elections before the parliamentary polls. The schedule might be announced in a month," Sohul said.

Once announced, polls to around 200 out of 482 upazila

parishads might be held in late August or early September, senior officials of the EC Secretariat said.

Until yesterday, printing of the final voter lists for 90 upazilas were completed. By the third week of July, the number will increase to 200 upazilas as printing has been expedited with field level registration being almost over, say officials engaged in voter registration.

Voter lists with photographs for another 130 upazilas are expected to be complete by mid-August, a senior official said. The entire task is likely to be completed in the end of September or early October, he

tions in October, the official added. The EC has however yet to decide how many upazila parishads will go through polls in the first phase, sources say.

Govt to talk with parties to end mix-up over polls

The government will hold discussions with the political parties to resolve misunderstandings over holding of the elections to local government bodies prior to the parliamentary election.

"There may be some misunderstandings over the local government polls. We will take more steps and hold direct talks with the parties to make everything clear, Education Adviser Hossain Zillur Rahman said when asked if the government would confront the major parties, which have announced to oppose and resist the local body polls.

He was talking to the reporters after a meeting with Communications and Public Works Adviser Ghulam Quader at the Secretariat yesterday.

Zillur said the government wants to strengthen the local bodies by holding the elections to them as well as to create an atmosphere of confidence before the parliamentary election.
