The Daily Star last night that the government took both the requests "positively" and assured that those would be considered.

Around 20 ALCWC members spoke at yesterday's three-hour long meeting held at AL President Sheikh Hasina's political office at Dhanmondi. AL acting President Zillur Rahman chaired the meeting.

At the meeting a small number of ALCWC members, however, termed the local government polls "stage-managed drama" and suggested not participating in any election under the present caretaker government.

Sources said all the AL leaders opined that the caretaker government must not hold the upazila parishad elections before holding the parliamentary polls.

The meeting was adjourned until 4:00pm today and the AL will make a formal decision at today's meeting.

According to party leaders, at the dialogue the AL will ask the government to create a congenial atmosphere for holding the city corporation and parliamentary elections.

They said the prime conditions for creating such an environment would be complete withdrawal of the state of emergency and unconditional and permanent release of the AL chief who is now in Canada.

AL Commerce and Industry Affairs Secretary Col (ret'd) Faruk

Khan said, "For the elections the government must create a congenial atmosphere by withdrawing the state of emergency and releasing our party chief permanently and unconditionally."

The AL will also ask the government to hold the parliamentary polls first.

Talking to The Daily Star, a number of AL leaders said they would not take any decision to boycott or resist the local government elections even if their demand is not settled at the dialogue because the grassroots level leaders in the four city corporations and nine municipalities have already made preparations for the polls. It would also be tough to prevent them from contesting the elections, they said.

"Those who will take part in the polls would rather be given green signal," an AL leader told The Daily Star after the ALCWC meeting.

Another AL organising secretary, Abdul Mannan, said they should join the election to see if the government holds the polls in a free and fair manner and also to see the government's intention regarding holding the parliamentary polls.

AL Publicity Secretary Asaduzzaman Noor said not contesting the polls would harm the party, but he suggested not saying "yes or no" about it before the dialogue so that the party can force the government to reach a consensus over their demands.

6 months more in jail.

They are on the run now. The court also ordered the authorities concerned to confiscate Alam's illegal wealth.

The court acquitted four of his family members as charges against them were not proved, but said that the ACC, which had filed the corruption case, can send notice to them asking for their wealth statements.

The acquitted are Alam's wife Hasina Chowdhury, daughters Mahmuda Akhter Monica and Mahfuz Akhter Mukta and son-in-law Salim Miah.

Chowdhury Alam was handed down 10 years' rigorous imprisonment (RI) for accumulating wealth illegally and three years' simple imprisonment for concealing information about his actual wealth in the wealth statement submitted to the ACC. The sentences will run consecutively.

ACC Assistant Director Abdul Latif filed the case with Khilgaon Police Station on June 13 last year, stating that the ward commissioner made a fortune of over Tk 6.94 crore beyond his known sources of income and concealed information about his property worth about Tk 93.29 lakh.

Alam's name was on the first list of corruption suspects published by the ACC.

On August 29 last year, a Dhaka court sentenced Alam to 10 years' RI for extorting Tk 20 lakh from a market owner in August, 2003.

Bangladesh Biman, MA Momen said the deal with Boeing is a milestone in the history of Biman.

The ceremony was attended by a good number of business people from the US and Bangladesh, congressional aides, high officials from the departments of State, Commerce, Transportation and Federal Aviation Administration, US Trade and Development Agency, and a cross-section of Bangladeshi expatriates.

Biman on April 22 signed a deal with Boeing to procure eight new aircraft—four 777-300ERs and four 787-8s—at a cost of Tk 8,728 crore (\$1.26 billion). The deal included an option on purchasing four more planes—two 777-300ERs and two 787-8s.

The same day the national flag carrier also signed a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with Boeing on buying two 737-800s. The MoU also had the option on purchasing two more 737-800s.

The number of schools and madrasas having cent per cent success was 1,429 in 2006 and 537 in 2005, statistics of Education Board Computer Centre show.

Besides, the number of least-performing institutions in SSC, Dakhil and SSC (Vocational) exams has also come down to 91 from previous year's 248.

Six schools from Dhaka, eight from Rajshahi, four from Jessore, two from Chittagong, 11 from Barisal, three from Sylhet, 17 under the BTEB and 40 under Madrasa Board failed to have any successful candidate this year.

In the Comilla Board, the number of educational institutions having no success is nil.

The number of least performing schools and madrasas was 193 in 2006, 424 in 2005, 548 in 2004 and 979 in 2003.

The number of expelled examinees has also been falling sharply for the last five years.

A total of 707 students were expelled this year, while the number was 985 last year, 1,291 in 2006, 1,746 in 2005, 3,381 in 2004, and 13,217 in 2003.

Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FCCI) and other trade bodies, Palli Karma Sahayak Foundation (PKSF), Bangladesh Institute of Development Studies (BIDS), Centre for Policy Dialogue (CPD), Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) and importers and suppliers of essential commodities.

Noting that coordinated market monitoring can bring down prices of essential commodities to a great extent, the adviser said, "We're going to further strengthen the market monitoring so we could glean market information in advance in order to keep the market stable," he said.

Pointing to rice-price differences between the local market and the international market, he said, "Rice prices on the international market are very high, but in Bangladesh they are not so steep."

On food safety, Zillur said the government has 9 lakh tonnes of rice in its warehouses across the country, adding that 3 lakh tonnes more would be imported from India by the end of next month.

"So, food reserves are enough to deal with any situation on the local market," he said.

The adviser said the government will prioritise the upcoming Aman cultivation like the Boro crop in order to ensure a bumper harvest.

Pointing to a recent IMF report on wheat prices, he said prices of the corn would go down soon as the prices were increased on speculation.

56,042 students came out successful with pass percentage of 73.00 and 3,679 GPA-5.

In Jessore Board, 75,209 students or 71.43 percent were successful with 4,079 GPA-5 achievers. Chittagong Board has seen 39,944 examinees passed with success rate of 72.62 percent and 4,316 GPA-5.

In Barisal Board, 33,458 students became successful with pass percentage 68.77, while number of GPA-5 achievers is 1,659. Under Sylhet Board 17,100 students came out successful with the pass percentage of 53.88 and 592 GPA-5.

The madrasa board produced tremendous good results among the nine boards with a pass rate of 82.06 percent. About 1.48 lakh students came out successful and of them, 5.83 percent or 10,526 students obtained GPA-5.

The vocational board scored a pass rate of 62.88 percent. Some 51,801 students passed the exam, while 57 students or 0.7 percent got GPA-5.

Science students have marked a significant progress with 84.32 percent pass rate, while the rate in humanities group is 59.85 percent and 75.82 percent in business studies and commerce group.

Like the previous years, schools in urban areas, especially in metropolitan cities, dominated the GPA-5 category and hundred percent pass record.

Among the top ten GPA-5 securing schools, ten are in the capital, eight in Rangpur, Bogra, and Pabna under Rajshahi Board, six in Comilla, Feni and Noakhali under Comilla, nine in Khulna, Kushtia, Jessore and Satkhira under Jessore, six in Chittagong Sadar and Double Mooring under Chittagong, ten in Barisal, Patuakhali, Bhola, Jhalakathi and Pirojpur under Barisal, and nine in Sylhet, Habiganj, Sunamganj and Sreemangal under Sylhet Board.

Ideal School and College produced highest 767 GPA-5 achievers followed by Vigarunnisa Noon School with 678 and Monipur High School with 652.

said they have been stuck at the point from where they started. They appealed to the court for opening the case.

When the court asked the prosecution to open the case the defence said, "If you [the judge] open the case in this way, it might seem to us that we will not get justice from you."

After about 30 minutes of heated exchanges, the court adjourned the hearing on charge framing and fixed July 7 as the next date for it.

Eight other accused in the case including former law minister barrister Moudud Ahmed and former state minister AKM Mosharraf Hossain were also produced before the court yesterday.

On December 9 last year, the Anti-Corruption Commission filed the case with Tejgaon Police Station against Khaleda and 10 others for abusing power in awarding a gas exploration and extraction deal to Canadian company Niko.

The visit was tentatively scheduled to take place last year but, for unavoidable circumstances, was postponed, according to an official.

The ambassador said General Maung Aye is likely to visit Bangladesh by the end of this year.

The CA said Bangladesh is interested in early conclusion of farming agreement with Myanmar for using its arable land for cooperation in the field of agriculture.

He also stressed the need for cooperation between the two countries for direct banking arrangement and enriching shipping link to promote trade.

On road link, the CA said Bangladesh is keen to open the trans-border land route through Myanmar to China, which will help the people in the region.

The envoy said road link will facilitate trade and people-to-people contact as well. He said Myanmar has indicated China about the tripartite road link.

The CA said annual consultation between Bangladesh and Myanmar will be held regularly for further strengthening the bilateral relations.

The envoy thanked the chief adviser for sending relief materials to Myanmar soon after the powerful cyclone 'Nargis' hit the country in May.

The CA expressed heartfelt sympathy for the people of Myanmar and their government over deaths, injuries and widespread loss of property in the cyclone. "Bangladesh, as a next-door neighbour, will stand beside Myanmar in its challenging time," he said.

He also expressed his gratitude as Myanmar had sent rice to Bangladesh after cyclone 'Sidr', according to CA's Press Secretary Syed Fahim Munaim

Some 500 students of the hall's rundown East Building, which was identified as too frail to weather an earthquake and declared unsafe for living in 2006, would be shifted to the new one.

Felling of the trees for the proposed structure however has drawn ire from many a campus resident and green activists. They believe the building could be built without having to hack down the old trees lining the Udayan School wall.

"All they [authorities] need is a good intention to spare the trees that would not hamper construction of the proposed building. Maybe they are cutting those down for financial gains," said Ramesh Chandra, a student of the hall.

Hall Provost Prof Ajoy Kumar Das said the decision to wipe out the trees was taken by a committee that comprises experts from the university's arboriculture and other departments concerned.

"The committee has decided to cut down only the trees that must be felled for the construction. The project would stop if the students feel they don't need the building at the expense of the trees," said Prof Ajoy, talking to The Daily Star over phone yesterday.

"If the trees next to the boundary wall are not felled now, they might come crashing down on the new building in future since there is no alternative to severing their roots to set up the basement," he added.

Students will form a human chain at the hall compound today to demand that the authorities construct the proposed structure leaving the trees untouched.

Meanwhile, Bangladesh Paribesh Andolan (Bapa) yesterday condemned the cutting down of trees on Jagannath Hall premises on the pretext of solving the seat crisis.

In a press release, it demanded rearrangement of the construction site so the old trees need not be cut down. Besides, it said, the authorities should take into consideration the position of the pond.

Dedicated to protecting and preserving the natural environment, the organisation also demanded an eco-friendly master plan for the development work on DU campus.

The number of male students having GPA 5 under the Madrasa Board stands at 8,003 while 2,523 female students secured GPA 5 under the board this year.

The pass percentage among male students under the Madrasa Board stands at 84.21 per cent while it is 79.47 per cent among female students.

Of 98,721 male candidates, 83,129 passed while among 81,864 female examinees 65,057 passed under the board.

Of the 82,375 students who took the SSC (vocational) exams, 51,801 passed. Female students have performed better than males only in the Technical Education Board.

The pass rate among female students under the board is 63.37 per cent while it is 62.67 per cent among male students.

Out of 57,262 male candidates under the board, 35,888 passed while among 25,113 female examinees 15,913 passed.

Of the 57 GPA 5 achievers under the board, 33 are male and 24 are female.
