It has recently come to the notice of RAYMOND LIMITED, a company incorporated in India and registered under the Indian Companies Act, 1913 and having its registered office at Plot No. 156/H. The Company is the registered proprietor and owner of the said trade mark and said artistic work in India. The said mark is also the subject matter of trade mark applications filed in Bangladesh which bear application nos. 63844 and 63845 in Classes relating to Textiles and Readymade Garments.

All Infringers are hereby warned that any further manufacture / marketing / import / sale of the duplicate counterfeit infringing and sub-standard goods under the Company's said trade mark and said artistic work will make them liable for civil and criminal legal action. Customers and members of the public and the trade are requested to bring to the notice of the Company such wrongful or infringing use of the said trade mark and said artistic work to institute appropriate legal proceedings, both civil and criminal to curb such infringing activities. In addition, the attention of all law enforcing agencies and customs authorities of Bangladesh is also being drawn to the above facts and circumstances with the request to extend all lawful cooperation to the Company.

All infringers are hereby warned that if necessary and required lawful compliances are not done within one week from the date of publication of this notice then the Company will be constrained to take all remedial legal actions including but not limited to action for all damages and compensations, against those doing and/or connected with the above illegal acts, under the Bangladesh laws, read with the provisions of "The Paris Convention. The Berne convention and The Trips Agreement, under the World Trade Organisation, to which international Conventions Bangladesh is a signatory and as such obliged to act accordingly. In addition the Company will also be constrained to take up the matter with the Bangladesh Anti-Corruption Commission as well as the Bangladesh Customs and other respective Authorities.

Job-oriented edn stressed

Speakers at a roundtable yesterday laid emphasis on public-private partnership to introduce job-oriented education in the country to face the challenges of globalisation.

They said a change in the mindset of people can help the nation to get rid of the curse of unemployment.

The roundtable was organised jointly by BSB-Cambrian College and the Samakal at Biam auditorium in the capital.

The speakers said vocational education is treated here as low category of education, and this is evident from the fact that children are given vocational training only when they are not good enough in general education.

"Only one percent of the budget for education is allocated for vocational education which also testifies the government's neglect for this sector," said Chief Coordinator of the National Teachers-Employees Front Principal Kazi Faruk Ahmed.

Principal of BSB-Cambrian College Dr Karunamoy Goswami said as garments and textile industries are flourishing in the country, there is ample scope of employment opportunity in this sector, but the number of textile engineering institutes is not increasing accordingly.

"The increasing number of private universities instead of the textile

engineering institutes indicates that both the people and the government are not aware of the demand of the time," he said, adding that due to this ignorance foreigners skilled in garments and textile industries are getting employment here.

Prof Hayat Mahmud said the ratio of students and teachers should be re-fixed to ensure proper education.

President of Teachers-Employees Oikya Jote Principal Mazharul Hannan said, "Good teacher is now more important than building up infrastructure to upgrade the education."

Prof Abul Bashar, director general of vocational education, said the government has plan to set up more polytechnic, textile, leather technology and graphic arts institutes in the country.

Samakal Editor Abed Khan, while moderating the roundtable, said the country is running through an inconsistent situation as every one is interested in performing a role which is not meant for him.

Chairman of BSB-Cambrian College Lion MK Bashar, Prof AAMS Arefin Siddique, Prof Anowar Hossain, Vice-chancellor of Ahsanullah Science and Technology University Dr Anowar Hossain, Prof Abul Barakat and Dr Kaberi Gayen also spoke on the occasion.

JU vice chancellor in his speech said to increase research facilities for the teachers and the students, linkage programme with local and foreign universities will be established.

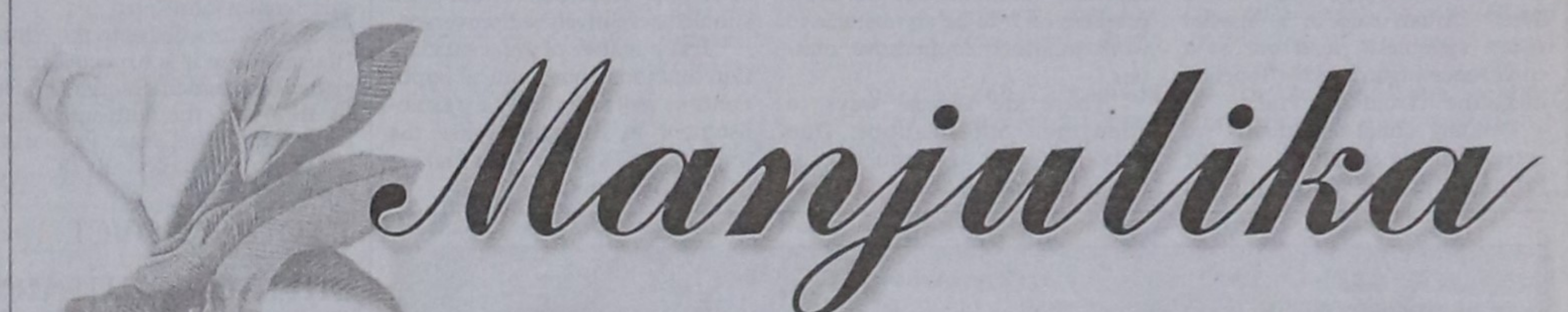
He said a four-storied residential building with the accommodation facilities for 500 students has been completed and steps have been taken to build a complete administrative building for the university.

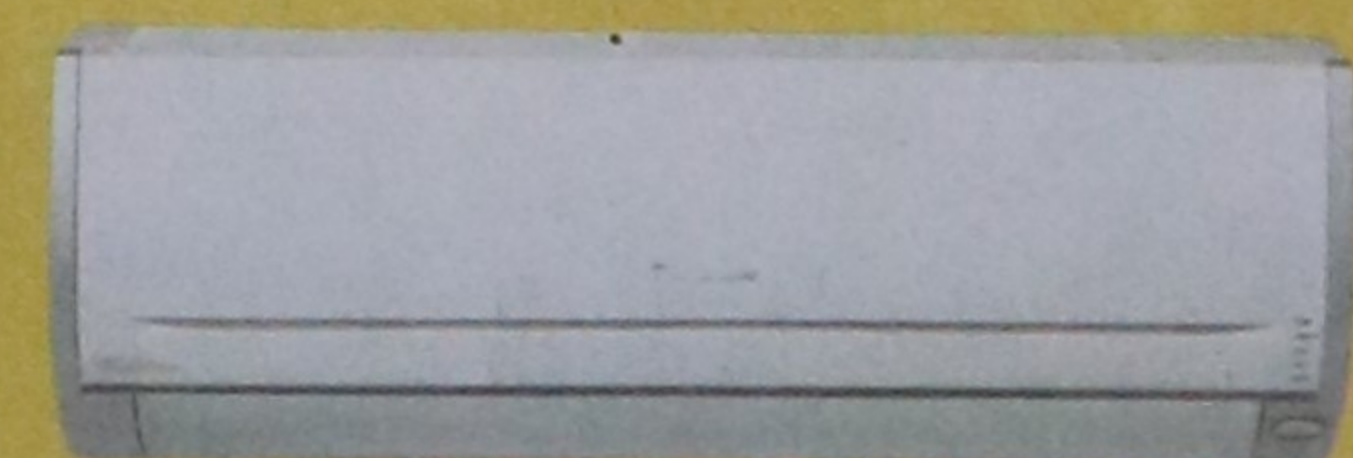
