## 3 JMB cadres get 20yrs for keeping explosives

A Panchagarh court yesterday sentenced three activists of outlawed Jama'atul Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) to 20 years rigorous imprisonment for possession of bomb making materials.

The court of Additional District and Sessions Judge Amulya Kumar Sarkar handed down the verdict in presence of the accused.

The convicts are Tanviruzzaman alias Murad, son of Nurul Islam from Sultanpur village under Debiganj upazila in Panchagarh, Ashjad Hossain alias Awakat, son of late Fazlul Haque from Panditpara village under Dimla upazila in Nilphamari and Shafiqul Islam, son of late Matiar Rahaman from Joyrampur village under Kaharol upazila in Dinajpur

The court also fined each of the JMB activists Tk 10,000 and in default of which each will have to serve an additional year in jail.

the budget through national radio and television on June 9 in absence of parliament.

On Sunday, the Council of Advisors at a meeting with the chief advisor in the chair approved the new budget with some additions and changes to income tax, VAT and social safety net, keeping unchanged the proposed size of budgetary allocation at Tk99,962 crore.


