Proclamation of emergency challenged

Writ petition filed with HC

A writ petition has been filed with the High Court (HC) challenging the legality of the president's proclamation of the state of emergency in the country on January 11 last

Two Emergency Power Orders (No 1 and 2), Emergency Power Ordinance (EPO) 2007 and Emergency Power Rules (EPR) 2007, issued through the proclamation of the state of emergency suspending the fundamental rights of the citizens and barring them from seeking bail from court in some cases, were also challenged in the same petition.

Rejoinder, our reply

Bangladesh Chashi Kalyan Samity (BCKS) in a rejoinder protested a report headlined "Five lakh depositors swindled by Jamaat's farmer wing" published in The Daily Star on July 7.

It said BCKS considers the report "a malicious attempt to spread venom against a political party which has clean image amongst people and has no working relationship with BCKS".

It claimed BCKS to be a "nonpolitical" and "non-profit" organisation for farmers' welfare and said it is not true that BCKS acted as financial front of Jamaat through illegal banking.

It claimed that central BCKS did not decided on closing down branches and the allegation of selling offices was irrelevant.

The rejoinder contradicted that Tk 100 crore was swindled out of five lakh people. It said they now have Tk 4,23,81,920 unpaid savings of 32,370 people and Tk 5,06,81,689 distributed loans among 12,832 people in 14 districts.

The rejoinder, however, confirmed "some irregularities" in Rajshahi district that they explained to have occurred following misappropriation of about Tk 12.40 lakh of people's savings by its staff.

Of the accused, Babar and Abu Sufian, director of a Bashundhara Group concern, were in the dock while Tarique was represented by his lawyer Sanaullah Mia. The rest are on the run.

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) filed the case of bribery to cover up the murder of Tarique, now detained senior Bashundhara Group executive Humayun Kabir Sabbir whose body was found outside a building in Bashundhara residential area on July 5, 2006.

The six are Babar, Bashundhara Group Chairman Ahmed Akbar

Sobhan alias Shah Alam, his two sons Shafiat Sobhan Sanvir and Sadaat Sobhan, Abu Sufian and Mia Nur Uddin Apu.

Tarique and former BNP lawmaker Qazi Saleemul Huq Kamal were included in the charge sheet after investigation found their involvement in the crime.

At the beginning of yesterday's proceedings, the judge rejected the discharge petition filed for Tarique, Babar and Sufian, and said there is enough primary evidence to frame charges against the accused.

Bijoy Sarani-Tejgaon link road stuck in court battle

Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk) is likely to miss the deadline of December 16 for completing the Bijoy Sarani-Tejgaon Link Road as it is now unable to demolish five buildings on the land of the road for legal tangles.

Owners of five buildings, acquired by the Deputy Commissioner's (DC) office, have filed cases against Rajuk with the High Court recently on grounds of being offered less money than they deserve as compensation for the acquired land and structures and a few other factors, said Abdul Hai, He said the ACC will submit the | member secretary of the affected building owners' association of Bijoy Sarani-Tejgaon Link Road. Owners of 17 structures includ-

ing six buildings, which were acquired, said they are yet to receive compensations for their land and structures.


