Politicians, educationist, woman activists and journalists said this at a discussion on 'Woman empowerment and education system: Context South Asia' held at the National Press Club with Karmojibi Nari Chairperson Shirin Akter in the chair.

Shirin Akter suggested forming a parliamentary caucus in the next elected government to work an ideal education system which will contribute to women empower-Nishat Jahan Rana and Johra

Proper steps should be taken immediately to ensure food security as the impacts of global climate change would seriously threaten it, Agriculture Adviser CS Karim said focus more on research, capacity vesterday.

"Food security of the country will be threatened most due to the consequences of climate change and we already have got some signs of that," he said at the inaugural ceremony of a consultation meeting on 'Climate Change Strategy and Action Plan-2008'.

The Ministry of Environment and Forest organised the daylong meeting at Biam auditorium in the

Speaking as the chief guest, the adviser said researchers should develop high yielding and drought-, flood- and salinity-tolerant varieties of crops as the climate change is causing an increase in the salinity level of soil and the frequency of floods and drought.

The country should be proactive in tackling the impacts of climate change, he said, adding that the government has already allocated Tk 300 crore funds for adaptation to climate change and has taken an initiative to find out ways to face it.

The adviser also urged the NGOs, civil society organisations and the media to come forward to help face climate change. "Everybody should contribute to the efforts to tackle the climate
