

HC grants SQ Chy, Pintu, Hashem bail

Asks govt why graft case proceedings not to be quashed

The High Court (HC) yesterday granted ad-interim bail for one month to three detained former BNP lawmakers -- SQ Chowdhury, Nasiruddin Ahmed Pintu and MA Hashem -- in separate corruption cases filed by the Anti-corruption Commission (ACC).

an HC bench comprising Justice Sharif Uddin Chaklader and Justice Md Emdadul Haque Azad stayed the case proceedings against the three for a month, and also issued separate rules upon the government and the ACC to explain within them. four weeks why the case proceed-

ings against the three should not be quashed.

ACC lawyers said the HC granted the bail to SQ Chowdhury, Nasiruddin Ahmed Pintu and MA Hashem on grounds that investigation reports in the cases had not been submitted within the stipulated 60 days of case filings and because the filings are deemed After hearing separate petitions, marred with procedural flaws by

2 mayoral candidates warned for violating code of conduct

The Returning Officer (RO) for Rajshahi City Corporation (RCC) poll yesterday issued warnings to two mayoral candidates and a councillor candidate for violating electoral code of conduct.

Mayoral candidates AHM Khairuzzaman Liton, a Nagorik Committee nominee and Progressive Democratic Party (PDP) leader advocate Raihanur Rahman were issued with the notices for using party affiliations during campaigning.

Meanwhile the cabinet division has asked the establishment minis-

try to transfer the additional divisional commissioner (ADC) of Rajshahi, for approving candidacy of five candidates not eligible to run for local polls, and take necessary action against him.

Although the RO for RCC had earlier rejected candidacies of five contestants for the post of councillorship during scrutiny, ADC (General) Mohammad Akhtaruzzaman, in his capacity as the election appeal authority for the August 4 polls, declared their candidatures valid on appeal.

The four had been earlier denied candidacy, as they were SEE PAGE 15 COL 7
