Spain bid a half-hearted farewell to Ronaldinho following news of his transfer from Barcelona to AC Milan, with the press noting that despite his talents he had become "tired of winning."

"Adios Ronaldinho," headlined the newspaper El Periodico.

The Brazilian superstar agreed late on Tuesday to leave Barcelona, where he was deemed surplus to requirements, and sign for AC Milan in a deal reported to be worth 30 million dollars.

The news of the deal was a bodyblow to English Premier League side Manchester City who had offered 32 million euros for the two-time world player of the cessor Frank Rijkaard.

He was not wanted at the Nou Camp by new coach Pep Guardiola following a dip in form last season.


He had become "tired of winning," despite his annual salary of 7.0 million euros, said the sports newspaper AS.

Barcelona and Milan officials held talks in the Catalan capital on Tuesday to thrash out the details of the 28-year-old's move.

The Gazzetta dello Sport reported that Milan will pay Barcelona 18.5 million euros (29.5 million dollars) for the World Cup winner with the figure likely to be increased by performance-related bonuses.

The news of the deal was a bodyblow to English Premier League titles, 49-year-old Ancelotti League side Manchester City who said that returning to the pinnacle had offered 32 million euros for the two-time world player of the year.

Ronaldinho, who was not Barcelona coach Pep Guardiola following a dip in form last season, scored 70 goals in 145 appearances for the Spanish side.

Meanwhile, Milan coach Carlo Ancelotti is looking forward to having Ronaldinho in his team as the San Siro giants aim to bounce back from their disappointing 2007/2008 season which saw them finish in fifth place in Serie A and miss out on Champions League qualification.

"The important thing is to have quality players and Ronaldinho is "AC Milan and FC Barcelona without doubt one of those," Ancelotti told Gazzetta dello Sport earlier Tuesday.

He added that the team will lineup so as to make best use of the "Tomorrow (Wednesday) the Brazilian and his international teammate Kaka, with the pair playing behind either veteran Italy international striker Filippo Inzaghi or teenage Brazilian sensation Alexander Pato.

"The president of the Spanish football federation (RFEF) Angel Maria Villar proposed the nomination of Del Bosque to the executive committee which was accepted," said a RFEF spokesman. "He will be presented on

Thursday at 1315 (1115 GMT)."

The 57-year-old Del Bosque will take charge of his first match on August 20 when Spain face Austria in a friendly international in Copenhagen.

His first competitive game will be a 2010 World Cup qualifier against Bosnia in Murcia on September 6.

Despite his two league titles (2001 and 2003) and two European crowns (2000 and 2002), his contract was not renewed by controversial president Florentino Perez who believed a Real coach should match the charisma of the socalled "galacticos" of Luis Figo, Zinedine Zidane, Ronaldo and David Beckham.

In April 2005, Del Bosque insisted he would never be tempted to return to Real declaring himself a "man of principle".

Italy striker Luca Toni on Wednesday hit back at criticism over his performances for Italy at Euro 2008.

The Bayern Munich striker was expected to be amongst the leading scorers having been top scorer in Germany's Bundesliga with 24 goals, as well as hitting 15 goals for

However, Toni suffered a nightmare tournament, notably against France where he missed a number of good opportunities to score.

But he refuses to take the blame for Italy's Euro 2008 quarterfinal "In Italy I received a lot of criti-

cism after the European Championships, because obviously people expected goals and I didn't score any," he told La Gazzetta dello Sport.

"I thought I played well, but clearly it is easier to criticise me, someone who plays abroad, than someone who plays in Italy."

Liverpool will make Robbie Keane one of the world's costliest players this week - splashing out £20m to lure him away from Tottenham.

That would take his career

Republic of Ireland skipper Keane is a life-long Liverpool fan and has made it clear he wants to move to Anfield.

Liverpool would be his sixth club with the latest £20m capping a series of multi-million pound

Coventry paid £6m to Wolves for Keane in 1999 and subsequent deals have seen him go to Inter Milan for £13m, Leeds for £12m and then Tottenham for £7m in

August 2002. Keane has scored 107 goals in 254 games for Spurs and bagged 33 goals in 80 Irish appearances.


Kop boss Rafa Benitez believes Keane will provide his side with much-needed pace up front alongside main striker and Spanish hero Fernando Torres.
