At least three people were killed and five others injured in wall collapses in Sirajganj and Comilla

Two people including a housewife died and a girl was seriously injured following a wall collapse caused by incessant rains that paralysed the normal life in Sirajganj district.

The dead are Shefali Khatun, 35, wife of Saiful Islam of Railgate area, and Shukur Ali, 60, of Binsara village under Tarash upazila.

According to police and local witnesses, Shefali and her daughter Bonya Khatun, 15, sustained serious injuries when a damaged pucca days. wall collapsed on them at 9.00am.

Bonya was taken to Sirajganj Sadar Hospital in critical condition, while Shefali died on the way.


