



, IOC confirms Iraq ban

The International Olympic Committee has confirmed a ban on Iraq from competing in the Beijing Games in a major blow to seven Iraqi athletes who had hoped to travel to China this August, an IOC letter said.

In the letter dated July 23 and addressed to the Iraqi Minister of Youth and Sports Jassim Mohammed Jaffer, the IOC said it was moving ahead with a ban first imposed on Iraq's athletes last month.

"In spite of all the joint efforts of IOC and OCA (Olympic Council of Asia), over the last months to find a positive solution with the Iraqi government authorities, we regretfully inform you that the decision of the IOC executive board dated 4 June 2008 to suspend the National Olympic Committee of Iraq is confirmed," said the letter, a copy of which was obtained by AFP on Thursday.

"We deeply regret this outcome which severely harms the Iraqi Olympic and Sports Movement and the Iraqi athletes but which is unfortunately imposed by the circumstances.

The IOC suspended Iraq for "political interference" in its national Olympic committee which was sacked last month and replaced by a new panel headed by Jaafar.

The IOC had warned of sanctions after Iraq disbanded its Olympic committee and other sports bodies on May 21, 2008.

After the initial suspension it was believed that up to seven Iraqi athletes would still participate in the Games beginning on August 8. However the IOC made clear in

Thursday's letter that the chance. for Iraqi athletes to compete under the Olympic flag in lieu of the national flag was over.

"The quota places obtained through the qualification systems and the invitation places offered by the Tripartite Commission to Iraqi athletes have been withdrawn and re-allocated to other NCOs," the

Triple ton gives Lanka pile of runs

Mahela Jayawardene equalled former Australian legend Don Bradman's record of nine centuries at one venue to put Sri Lanka in a commanding position in the opening Test against India here on Thursday.

Skipper Jayawardene cracked a stylish 136 to help his side post 422-4 in the first innings at stumps on the second day.

The Sri Lankan captain's ton at the Sinhalese Sports Club ground equalled Bradman's nine at one venue -- the Australian great's coming at the Melbourne Cricket

But Javawardene was not the lone batsman to feast on the Indian bowling on a placid track as opener Malinda Warnapura (115) and Thilan Samaraweera (111 not out) also contributed handsomely to their team's total.

Tillakaratne Dilshan was unbeaten on 20 after earning a reprieve under a new experimental rule allowing players to seek a second opinion on umpiring deci-

He was on one when given out caught behind off left-arm fast bowler Zaheer Khan by umpire Mark Benson of England, but asked the official to review the decision.

Benson consulted TV umpire Rudi Koertzen of South Africa before changing his decision as the ball had not made contact with the

Jayawardene earlier added 155 for the third wicket with Warnapura and 148 for the next with Samaraweera to put his team on course for a big total. He hit one six and 10 fours in his 23rd hundred in 96 Tests.

Left-hander Warnapura, 50 overnight, smashed 14 fours in his second Test century in five matches.

India's seamers and spinners failed to put pressure on

Jayawardene, Warnapura and Samaraweera, who were quick to punish errors in line and length during their knocks.

The visitors took just two wickets in the day after the hosts resumed at 85-2, with off-spinner Harbhajan Singh and fast bowler Ishant Sharma the successful

Harbhajan struck in the afternoon when he had Warnapura caught by former captain Rahul Dravid in the slips, but not before the batsman had strengthened the team's position.

Citycell has asked the Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) told hold at least 16 tournaments each year during their three-year contract, which was finalised yesterday.

The cellular phone operator, BFF's 'partner in progress', will provide Tk 16.5 crore for the next three years.

The two organisations had signed an MoU on July 15 but the deal was officially sealed at an agreement signing ceremony at the BFF Bhaban yesterday.

BFF president Kazi Salahuddin and Citycell's CEO Michael Seymour signed the agreement on behalf of the two parties.

The BFF also received Tk one crore, the first instalment of the payment, and will get a further one crore before the start of the 2nd B. League. The rest of the money will arrive step by step based on need of the federation. "We have settled the details and

conditions of the deals after face to face discussions. Now everything has become official," told a relived BFF chief Salahuddin.

Among the 16 programmes to be organised by the football's

governing body, Citycell will be title sponsors of three tournaments -Federation Cup, B. league and School Championship -- and partner of the remaining.


