

# Amend Vested Properties Return Act 2001

Minority Sangram Parishad urges govt

Bangladesh Minority Sangram Parishad yesterday demanded of the government to amend the Vested Properties Return Act 2001 to ensure the rights of the religious minority group.

At a press conference at Dhaka Reporters' Unity (DRU) auditorium, the Parishad leaders said the Act should be amended with the provision of returning the properties to the successors.

They also demanded the cancellation of the Enemy Property Act.

In a keynote paper, Parishad Senior Vice-president Dr Shoilendranath Chanda said the Enemy Property Act was the result of India-Pakistan war in 1965.

After the independence, it was renamed as Vested Property Act that allowed the government to confiscate property from individuals it deemed as an enemy of the state, he added.

Dr Shoilendranath said the Awami League government enacted the Vested Properties Return Act in 2001 in an effort to give back the confiscated properties to their owners.

However little progress was made in returning or compensating the lost property during the period of the immediate past government, he added.

The speakers also demanded implementation of Chittagong Hill Tracts Peace Treaty, formulation of Debtor Board for the Hindus and similar boards for the Christians and the Buddhists, and declaration of Hindu, Christian and Buddhism along with Islam as state religion.

## RCC mayor aspirants vow to work neutrally for dev

The mayoral aspirants of the Rajshahi City Corporation (RCC) yesterday pledged to work neutrally for the development of the city if elected in the August 4 polls.

They promised that they would take initiatives to ensure the supply of pure drinking water as well as gas supply through the pipeline, set up agro-based factories, resume production at sericulture industry, dredge the Padma, ensure transparency in the corporation's activities, enhance civic facilities and accountability of the elected representatives as well as the corporation officials and employees, create vacancy and ensure equal opportunity of underprivileged community.

Chief Reporter of the Sonali Sangbad Hassan Millat moderated the dialogue where RU teacher Shah Azam Santonu, Editor of the daily Liakat Ali, Bangladesh Institute of Panos representative Aktar Mahmud and BUP representative Rashid Ripon were also present.

The speakers called on the mayoral candidates for forming a city government system to ensure citizens' facilities.

A large number of voters, including professionals, businessmen, social and cultural activists, teachers and students, participated in the programme.

The voters also vowed to elect efficient and honest candidates and not to vote for any war criminals in the RCC polls.

## Pakistan wants broad-based ties with Bangladesh

HC inaugurates Ctg Press Club Institute of Technology

Pakistan High Commissioner to Bangladesh Alamgir Babar yesterday said his country wants a broad-based relationship with Bangladesh for the welfare of people between the two countries.

"We believe in partnership in different prospective fields for the welfare of people of both sides", he said while speaking as the chief guest at a function of handing over computers and other logistics support for Chittagong Press Club (CPC) Institute of Technology yesterday.

Pakistan High Commission in Dhaka donated 10 computers, adequate number of printers and furniture to the CPC to establish the institute.

With CPC President Ali Abbas in the chair, the function was addressed, among others, by CPC General Secretary Ejaj Yousufi, senior journalist M Nasirul Haq, general secretary of Chittagong Union of Journalists, Nazimuddin Shayamol, CPC Joint Secretary Khorshed Alam and chairman of Fairway Automobiles Jharka Banu.

Speaking on the occasion, Babar said Pakistan has sincere intention to work together for the peace, stability, progress and prosperity of every nation in this region under a broad-based relationship.

He said the computers sets would help journalists as well as their family members to acquire knowledge on information technology, which would ultimately contribute to achieve socio-economic progress of the country.

He assured of donating more five computers and faxmachines to the CPC within a short time to enrich the capacity of the CPC Institute of Technology.

Meanwhile, the authorities of Fairway Automobiles Ltd have donated Pakistan made New Asia brand a 4-stroke CNG autorickshaw for CPC Welfare Fund.

The chairman of the Fairway Automobiles Ltd Jharka Banu told the function that her company would donate 10 such autorickshaws among distress families of freedom fighters on next victory day.

Shahnaz Pervin, a victim, filed a case against five persons including Ansarul Alam Chanu, a former chairman of Shimulbari union, as main accused for the cheating.

## Five-yr plan underway to develop skilled workforce

The Ministry of Education has undertaken a plan to boost professional skills of technical workers through new policies, in the wake of growing competitiveness for skilled labour at home and abroad.

As part of the plan, a five-year technical education reform project styled 'Bangladesh Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) Reform' was launched yesterday.

Launched at Hotel Sonargaon, the project mainly focuses on rejuvenating country's technical and vocational education and training schemes.

Director General of the Directorate of the Technical Education Prof Mohammad Abul Bashar chaired it.

Education Secretary Mohammad Momtajul Islam attended the function as the chief guest, while Labour and Employment Secretary Dr Mahfuzul Haque and Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment Secretary Abdul Matin Chowdhury were present as special guests.

Director of Skills and Employment Department of the International Labour Organisation (ILO), Geneva, Christine Evans Klock and Charge d'Affairs of the Delegation of the European Commission to Bangladesh Brian Forey were also present.

Momtajul Islam said the proposed reforms in the technical and vocational education systems would not only help creating skilled workforce attuned to world requirements but also supplement poverty alleviation process through job creation at home and abroad.

Dr Mahfuzul Haque said the project was to contribute largely to the improvement of productivity in industrial units worldwide.

Dr Mahfuz said the five-year project, which would come to an end in 2012 at a cost of Tk 136 crore, has a special focus on strengthening the mechanism to meet the labour market demand.

"The project has some major components including upgrading the TVET policies at all segments, improvement of training curriculum, exploration of labour market information and improving access of underprivileged groups to such opportunities," Matin Chowdhury said.

Prof Bashar said Bangladesh could be benefited immensely from its promising pharmaceutical and RMG sector through improving the skills of their managers, staffs and workers. The skills of concerned trainers and teachers should also be raised, he added.

Education Secretary Mohammad Momtajul Islam said the proposed reforms in the technical and vocational education systems would not only help creating skilled workforce attuned to world requirements but also supplement poverty alleviation process through job creation at home and abroad.

Upon completion of the project, he hoped, Bangladesh would have an energetic and dynamic workforce, who would project the country with a changed image before the world.

Terming the project as comprehensive to boost work skills, Brian said the development of skilled workforce could play a significant role to produce quality products, bring higher return from exports and generate employment opportunities at home and abroad.

"One of our aims is to make arrangements for the trial of the war criminals, and we are expressing our solidarity with the Sector Commanders' Forum and their activities," he added.

"We also want to resist the anti-liberation war forces including Rajakar, Al-Badr and Al-Shams socially and politically," he added.

The press conference was organised to mark the launching of the forum.

Announcing the objectives of the organisation, the forum leaders said they will work to restore the spirit of the War of Independence.

"We will also identify the war criminals, publish their names and make public the illegal wealth made by the anti-liberation war elements," they added.

The Forum will have four organisational tiers functioning at upazila, district, division and central level.

Phensidyl seized
