Argentina see off Japan

Athens gold medallists Argentina posted a 1-0 win over Japan on Tuesday in the last tune-up match for the Beijing Olympics, a contest that was called off in the second half due to heavy rain and light-

The referee halted the game 38 minutes into the second half due to the lightning, and the game was scrapped seven minutes later.

The only goal came in the 68th minute soon after the visitors faced a scare when midfielder Yohei Kajiyama's shot was saved by Argentine goalkeeper Oscar Ustari.

Argentina counter-attacked, with Sergio Aguero speedily moving up the centre to send the ball to fellow forward Angel Di Maria in the front line, who fired home from the edge of the box.

Japan fought throughout the

match. Midfielder Keisuke Honda's middle shot hit the bar in the 58th minute, while Honda created Japan's best chance on a free kick in the 10th minute -- though Masato Morishige's shot was saved by Ustari.

"I have mixed feelings, I can't help it," said Japan coach Yasuharu Sorimachi. "Our real competition starts in Beijing. We are going to prepare for it from now on."

At the Olympics, Argentina will play Ivory Coast, Australia and Serbia in Group A, while Japan will take on the United States, Nigeria and The Netherlands in Group B.

Barca may keep Eto'o

Barcelona could reverse their decision to sell striker Samuel Eto'o due to the positive attitude shown by the Cameroon international in pre-season training, club president Joan Laporta said on Monday.

"Eto'o is showing total commitment and that part of his character is something we all like to see. He has had a very positive attitude during the pre-season," Laporta told a news conference.

"At one time we did think the most convenient thing was to change things in order to renew the team, especially in terms of the most important players, but I understand that nothing in this world is set in stone.

"I don't think the issue with Samuel is irreversible or definitive and we need to look at things carefully.... His recovery both in mental and physical terms will influence the club's final decision."

Barca's new coach Pep Guardiola said that both Eto'o and Ronaldinho did not feature in his plans when he took charge after the sacking of Frank Rijkaard at the end of last season.

Ronaldinho has since been sold to AC Milan, while the club has brought in Martin Caceres, Gerard Pique and Daniel Alves to bolster their defence and Aleksandr Hleb and Seydou Keita to strengthen the

midfield. Laporta praised Guardiola's work with the new-look squad who have returned from a successful pre-season tour of Scotland.

"What Guardiola has done is bring some order to things and that is important," said Laporta. "He has done won the respect of the players with his actions."

Gallas sorry for captaincy errors

William Gallas has apologised for the mistakes he made last season as Arsenal captain and promised to learn from his errors should Arsene Wenger entrust him with the onfield leadership of the side in the upcoming campaign.

Gallas was criticised for setting a bad example when, after Birmingham City secured a late draw against the Gunners at St Andrews in February, he spent several minutes sitting on the turf after the final whistle in what appeared to be a protest at the decision that led to City's equalising penalty.


