No possibility to go back to pre-Jan 11

Says home adviser STAFF CORRESPONDENT

Home Adviser MA Matin yesterday ruled out any possibility of the country sliding back into last year's pre-January 11 situation.

"We're very cautious about it," he told reporters when asked about the possible consequences of detained corruption suspects and people with criminal records being freed on bail.

"There's no question of plunging back into the previous situation. I can assure you of this," he said at the shipping ministry.

He said the High Court is granting bail to political leaders and businessmen sued for corruption through legal procedures.

HC asks for medical reports of Nasim

The High Court (HC) yesterday directed the inspector general (IG) of prisons and LabAid Hospital authorities to submit the medical reports of former home minister and Awami League leader Mohammad Nasim to the court by August 5 for examining those.

An HC bench comprising Justice Md Muzammel Hossain and Justice Syed AB Mahmudul Huq passed the order during the hearing on a petition filed by Nasim seeking bail in a case in which he was sentenced to 13 years' imprisonment.

Kuwait deports over 100 Process on for release Bhuiyan freed on

Several hundred other Bangladeshi workers await similar fate

Over a hundred Bangladeshi workers yesterday arrived in Dhaka from Kuwait that deported them over allegations of instigating labour

Several hundred others who have been put in jail might also be deported soon.

Kuwaiti police have so far arrested about 1,000 workers for staging demonstrations. About 300 of them will be released as their involvement in it was not found, said a press release of foreign affairs ministry yesterday.

As per a decision of the Kuwaiti cabinet, only those involved in instigating labour unrest and staging demonstrations will be kept detained, sued or deported for security reasons, the press release said without mentioning the number of workers to be deported.

Thousands of workers had been on strike in Kuwait since Thursday protesting low wages, bad working conditions and exploitations.

Kuwait has told the Charge d'affaires at the Bangladesh Embassy that it has no discriminatory policy regarding Bangladeshis and the Kuwaiti law enforcers & resisted the demonstrators to avoid 5 violence, the press release said.

Around 16,000 workers have already joined work while others who are still on strike have been asked to go back to work.
