through some of the country's prime forests, it dawned on us that the forest department is neither capable of preserving the forest nor is it able to conserve the wildlife. Dr Khan, from his worldwide

experience, then suggested some new mechanisms that might save the both -- forest and wildlife.

He said the IUCN has an international commission for protected areas thorough which it has categorised the world's natural reserves and forests into four categories. Under the first category falls the huge nature reserves ranging from 100 square kilometres to a couple of thousand square kilometres, where public access is very limited or zero. Here public interaction is kept to a minimum level. National parks are always managed scientifically by a body roamed from Whykeong to Teknaf in assumptions, the ministry of forest under a wildlife conservation entity.

In the second category comes the wildlife sanctuary where people's activities may be allowed within buffer zones. The core zones are kept for scientific studies and proper management. In the last category falls the game
