Iftekhar said the chief adviser headquarters would be located in held bilateral meetings with each one of the eight leaders attending. Each of these meetings led to useful outcomes, "he added.


The advisor said this was also an important year in the sense that many Saarc nations are undergoing major constitutional and political transformations. Pakistan, Nepal, Bhutan and Maldives are among them.

"We ourselves will be holding elections in December. The meeting provided us an occasion to exchange experiences and learn from one another," Iftekhar said.

The advisor said, "South Asia is seen as politically a major force in global politics. That is why a large number of countries and organisations are keen to join as observer. We already have on the list European Union, the US, Japan, China, South Korea, Iran, Mauritius, Australia, and Myanmar. We have now decided to put a three year moratorium on fresh membership and are drawing up a set of modalities in that correction."

He said, "It is true that the devel opment of Saarc is not spectacular. That is understandable given the nature of our history. But the future is bright and I have every confidence that the future belongs to South Asia."

Iftekhar said, "every achievement of Saarc fills Bangladesh with pride as it is Bangladesh which conceived the idea that led to the establishment of this body."

The results of the first and second year final examinations of the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) Programme under Bangladesh Open University (BOU) have been published in the grading system, says a press release.
