India's one-day and Twenty20 captain Mahendra Singh Dhoni has been awarded the country's top sporting honour, cricket board

officials said Monday. Dhoni, 27, has been named winner of the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna award for 2007 after he led a young Indian side to triumph in the Twenty20 World Cup in South Africa last year.

The wicketkeeper-batsman also captained the team to a memorable tri-series victory in Australia earlier this year.

"Dhoni has been declared the recipient of the Rajiv Gandhi Khel Ratna Award, the country's most prestigious sports award," the board said in a statement.

Cricket board president Sharad Pawar said Dhoni was a deserving winner.

Dhoni is the second cricketer after batting genius Sachin Tendulkar to win the award. Tendulkar bagged the honour in

Right-hander Dhoni has amassed 1,418 runs from 29 Tests and 3,600 runs in 115 one-day internationals. He has also taken 186 catches and effected 186 stumpings in Tests and ODIs after making his international debut in
