#### Drogba out of season opener

Didier Drogba will miss the start of Chelsea's season, manager Luiz Felipe Scolari said Monday.

Scolari said the 30-year-old, who has spent the summer recuperating from a knee injury, is unlikely to feature until the very end of August.

He will miss the Blues' opening Premier League games against Portsmouth, on August 17, and Wigan a week later.

"Didier will not play in our first game against Portsmouth and will probably miss the second against Wigan. If there are no more problems he should be ready for the game after that," said Scolari.

Scolari has pencilled in the London derby against Tottenham on August 31 for a possible return but admits he will not rush the Ivory Coast star.

"But when you have a knee injury, you just never know," said the Brazilian.

"I have been getting a progress report from the doctor every day. "He's getting better and is work-

ing with a fitness coach back at the training ground. I hope he will be ready to start training next week. But he will not play until he is in good condition.

The new Chelsea boss will have to rely on Nicolas Anelka as his only frontman for the first two games as Salomon Kalou is away at the Olympics.

#### Messi to inherit number 10

Barcelona's Argentine striker Lionel Messi will take over the number 10 shirt that was last worn by Brazil's Ronaldinho, who was transfered to AC Milan, the club said Sunday.

The number 10 shirt is usually the privilege of the club's star player.

Messi, 21, has until now worn the number 19, which has not been assigned to any other player for next season.

Brazilian Daniel Alves, a preseason signing, was given the number 20, formerly worn by Portugal's Deco, who has gone to Chelsea.

Messi has joined the Argentina national squad for the Olympics in Beijing and will miss the Catalan club's US tour.

The Argentina international has been at the centre of a tug of war between club and country with Barcelona trying to retain him for their Champions League qualifier tie in August.

West Ham United will retire the number six shirt worn by former Upton Park and England great Bobby Moore, the Premier League club said on their website

(www.whufc.co.uk) on Monday. Moore, who died in 1993, is one of the most celebrated names in English football, having lifted the Jules Rimet trophy in 1966 as captain of England's World Cup-

winning team. A ball-playing central defender, he was one of three West Ham players in Alf Ramsey's victorious England team, alongside striker Geoff Hurst and midfielder Martin Peters.

Moore, who was at West Ham from 1958-74, was the club's most successful captain, lifting the FA Cup in 1964 and European Cup Winners' Cup the following

He died from bowel cancer at the age of 51.

West Ham chief executive officer Scott Duxbury told the club's website: "When we were talking about ways to mark 50 years since Bobby Moore's debut, there was only one true gesture that would do him justice - retiring the number six shirt he made his own."

Moore made his first appearance for the club aged 17 against Manchester United in Sept. 1958 and to mark the anniversary West Ham will play Spanish club Villarreal in a pre-season friendly on Saturday for the inaugural Bobby Moore Cup.

After leaving West Ham, Moorewho won 108 caps for Englandplayed for Fulham and American clubs San Antonio Thunder and Seattle Sounders.

Matthew Upson, the England defender who has been wearing the number six for West Ham, will take the number 15 shirt.
