

Haider Chowdhury Roton. The demonstrators burnt an effigy of the VC, ransacked windowpanes at his office and later damaged cars on the street.

Roton was arrested immediately after his release from Mymensingh jail yesterday afternoon as the High Court (HC) declared his detention illegal in response to a writ petition filed by his father.



HC stays tax evasion case against Dr Mosharraf

The High Court (HC) yesterday stayed for three months the proceedings of a tax evasion case against detained BNP leader and former health minister Dr Khandker Mosharraf Hossain filed by the National Board of Revenue (NBR).

Responding to a writ petition filed by Mosharraf, an HC bench comprising Justice ABM Khairul Haque and Justice Md Abu Tariq also issued a rule on the government asking it to explain within six weeks why the case proceedings against him should not be declared without lawful authority.

Deputy Director of the NBR Muftasibur Rahman on July 27 filed the case against Mosharraf under the Emergency Power Rules (EPR) with the Senior Special Judge's Court in Dhaka on charge of evading income tax of Tk 63.23 lakh in fiscal years s1996 to 2006.
