

Bangladesh fails to restore CPA membership

UNB, Dhaka

Bangladesh failed in its appeal to restore its membership in the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (CPA) as the parliamentary government has not yet been resumed.

Delegates at the general assembly of the 54th CPA conference in Kuala Lumpur voted against the appeal, according to a report released by the Malaysian based Staronline.

The report said Speaker Barrister Jamiruddin Sirar made the appeal against the decision of executive committee of the CPA to place it in abeyance since April 7 last year pending the resumption of parliamentary government.

In a statement, the executive committee said it was likely that the parliamentary government would resume in 2009 and it would then be able to return the Bangladeshi CPA branch to full active status.

Sylhet local body elections were free, fair

Democracywatch, a leading election monitoring organisation, yesterday said the local body elections in Sylhet were held in a free, fair and peaceful atmosphere.

It said the elections were held with the spontaneous participation of all, a press release said.

Democracywatch, which deployed 380 stationary observers on behalf of Election Working Group (EWG), covered 380 booths

and 65 centres in Sylhet City Corporation.

Besides, a group of mobile observers covered 30 other centres to monitor the election environment, voting and counting process as well as to act as a civil society watchdog build public confidence in this historic election.

About 99 percent observers of Democracy watch reported that voter's did not face any obstruction on way to their polling centres to cast their votes, the release added.

MD COURSE IN CCM AT BIRDEM Death of critical patients to reduce, hope experts

Doctor of Medicine (MD) course in Critical Care Medicine (CCM) was introduced at BirDEM hospital in the city yesterday.

Speaking on the occasion at BirDEM auditorium, the experts said the CCM is a new development in medical science where special care different from standard care is provided for patients with potentially reversible and life threatening conditions.

The CCM can go a long way in reducing death of critical patients and preventing irreparable damage to vital organs of patients in hospitals, they said.

The qualified CCM specialists can take urgent decisions under any emergency situations and assume the primary responsibilities of the patients, they added.

The speakers said in developed countries the CCM has been operational for a long time easing hassles of patients in hospitals.

They said the CCM is a procedure-oriented specialty involving intensive care, observation and sophisticated treatment with a view to revert critically ill patients to normal life.

A qualified critical care specialist who is also often termed as "intensivist" serves as a team leader of specialist doctors in discharging treatment to a patient suffering from multi-organ failure or dysfunction as this treatment needs medical reports of different specialties like cardiology, nephrology, infectious diseases, pulmonology and neurosurgery, said the speakers.

MD course in CCM will bring a new horizon in professional skills, they said, adding that the CCM department of BirDEM will conduct the course.

BirDEM Director General Maj Gen (retd) Prof Ziauddin Ahmed presided over the programme where Prof MO Farup, head of the CCM department, delivered the welcome address.


